

In 1898 the Hotel was known as the Osborn House and was owned and operated by Mrs. A. Menefee. At the time the addition was built, Mr. & Mrs. Buel Blakely were proprietors. The Blakely's also operated the first telephone switchboard in the hotel building, and the switchboard remained in the building until the early 1940's.
