DID YOU KNOW THAT THE UNITED STATES WILL BE EXPERIENCING AN ANNULAR SOLAR ECLIPSE THIS FALL? A solar eclipse occurs when the moon blocks light from the sun. During an annular solar eclipse, the moon is at or near its greatest distance from Earth. This results in the sun creating a ring around the moon.

UP TO 64% OF THE SUN WILL BE COVERED BY THE MOON DURING THIS EVENT. Maximum obscuration will occur at 11:57 a.m. Due to our location, we will not have the best views of the eclipse, but our site is a great place to learn and watch the sky change.

JOIN US IN CELEBRATING THE ANNULAR ECLIPSE. From 9 a.m. to 1 p.m., interpreters will be stationed at an informational table with facts and activities relating to the eclipse. At 10 a.m., we will have a solar story time for children. All activities are FREE and will take place across from the playground in the picnic area.
