



MILL VIEW TRAIL

1.50-miles loop TRAIL RATING: Rugged ESTIMATED HIKING TIME: 1 hour, 40 minutes

A scenic view from a bluff overlooking the picturesque Dillard Mill and pond is the reward for hiking Mill View Trail. The trail goes up a steep grade and loops through an area of glades and upland forests. Parts of the trail are made of wooden and stone steps and there are bluffs and dropoffs next to the trail. A bridge crosses one stream and may be slippery even in dry weather. There is also a water crossing at Huzzah Creek without a bridge and during periods of high water, this part of the trail is inaccessible. By continuing straight on the trail, a 0.13 mile spur leads to Dillard Mill. A creek crossing can be accessed by turning left. White connector 1 is available to shorten the hike.



Rules of the Trail

- Only hikers as designated, are permitted on the park trails. Bicycles are prohibited.
- All pets must be leashed for their protection and that of visitors and wildlife.
- Removal of plants, animals, rocks, downed timber, artifacts or relics is prohibited.
- Cutting implements such as saws and hatchets are not allowed on trails.
- No hunting or discharging of firearms is permitted.
- All other rules and regulations pertaining to park use are applicable to trail users.

NOTE: Mosquitos, ticks and chiggers are abundant May through mid-October. Be prepared with insect repellent.
