









2024 Spring Drill and Woodruff Gun Dedication

Annual 4th of July celebration was very well attended despite being rescheduled after a rain out on the 4th.







Early in the year, we dedicated our new historically correct Woodruff Gun and followed that with the Eclipse with an estimated 1000 visitors to The Battle of Pilot Knob and 14,808 visitors at Elephant Rocks during the Eclipse. Our partnership with local chamber and tourism resulted in a big increase in tourism to the Arcadia Valley. Our annual fireworks display for The 4th of July was very busy and other outreach efforts like Bike safety and Cooking in History were very popular. Local Girl scouts helped monitor bee populations and our Track chair program has increased exponentially.
