The date of 1899 is an estimation based partly on the style of the home, as records are scarce and Sanborn Fire Insurance Maps do not cover this area until 1909. According to the Sanborn Fire Insurance Maps, this home has had a small addition to its rear (south) facade sometime between 1909 and 1913, with a small enclosure of the southwest corner occurring sometime between 1913 and 1926. The City Directories show J.W. Coen and Gladys Coen at the address in 1917 and W.E. Rapson as owner/occupant in 1922.

2X. This one story Queen Anne home has a limestone foundation, asbestos shingle siding and a full length porch. The porch is supported by six turned posts. The porch has simple wood railings accentuated with a jigsawn decoration, and spindle frieze above. The wood steps to the porch are located off center to the east on the main facade, as is the main entrance. A small louvered vent is located at the top of the apex in the gable on the west end of the main facade with a small window below. The gable is covered in fishscale shingles.

2Y. Located on a small lot in a densely populated district among homes of similar construction. The now vacant lot to the west was once the site of the "Crystal Lithium Spring" and the Maplehurst Boarding House. This home is nearly identical to the two homes to the east.



According to the 1909 Sanborn Fire Insurance Map, this building had not yet been constructed. However the 1913 map shows the east half of the building as the office of Dr. S.D. Henry and the west half as a bath house. The City Directories show Dr. S.D. Henry at the address in 1917 and again in 1922. It appears that the bath house did not operate for long. The 1919 Kansas City Long Distance Telephone Co. Directory lists 329¹/₂ as "The Sterling" rooming house, with 5 rooms available. A c.1925 tourist booklet, "Missouri's National Health Resort" lists the Sterling's rates at from \$4 to \$10 per week. The 1926 Sanborn map shows the entire building as a rooming house.

The following is a quote from the "Picturesque Excelsior Springs," 1903, p. 5.

Dr. S.D. Henry is a graduate of the Kansas City Homeopathic Medical college and a member of the Homeopathic state and national societies. He has been a resident of this city for ten years and while he has been actively engaged in the practice of his profession he has also been identified with the development and improvement of the city. He is president of the Commercial club and will take pleasure in answering inquiries concerning the waters or in reference to business propositions. Office on Broadway, near Siloam spring. Tel. 167. Residence in Forest Park. Tel. 149.

2X. This two story, brick, rectangular commercial building has multiple (two) storefronts, and a "two-part commercial block" facade arrangement. There are three doors, evenly spaced, in the center of the main facade, flanked by large display windows (now covered). The bulkheads are brick. Above each display window are three transom areas, also covered. There are five 1/1, double-hung windows with limestone sills, evenly spaced, across the second story. The cornice area is demarcated by corbelled brick courses.

T. This building is listed on the local Register of Historic Places. The following information is based on the 1983 local nomination form.

The building was built in 1916 with a \$10,000 grant from the Carnegie Foundation, through the efforts of the Civic Improvement Association to establish a library and reading room in Excelsior Springs. Prior to the purchase of the lot, a local committee had corresponded with George Kessler, landscape architect for the Excelsior Springs park system, in hopes that he would find a suitable spot for the library within Siloam Park. Kessler did not feel that there was a proper spot within the park, and his letter indicates that he really did not want to get involved with the controversy which was arising. Two groups of citizens then tried to promote and purchase lots in different locations. The present site at the corner of Broadway and Saratoga apparently pleased few people, and letters were sent to the Carnegie Foundation asking them to intervene, which they refused to do. In the meantime, the City purchased the lot for \$1,000, and eventually the building contract was awarded to the lowest bidder, Bates, Cook & Wilson, for \$8,803.94. According to the nomination:

Based on past building projects around the country, the Carnegie Foundation developed a leaflet entitled "Notes on Library Buildings" which was written in 1911 as a guide to each community along with the promise of funds. This was intended to prevent building blunders instead of attempting to correct them. All too many buildings were planned with expensive exteriors and inefficient, uneconomical interiors and usually there were no architects experienced in building libraries, particularly those for small or medium-sized towns.

The six editions of the "Notes on Library Buildings" varied only slightly in presentation and information. They provided certain minimum standards for the main requirements of accommodations in the libraries built with Carnegie funds. Each community was to obtain the greatest amount of usable space consistent with good taste in building. According to these "Notes" the best results for a small library could be obtained in a rectangularshaped building with a basement and one floor (other-shaped buildings would require extra attention and planning to avoid waste of space). The main floor, 12 to 15 feet high, would accommodate the bookstacks, the circulation desk area, and suitable space for reading by adults and children. Rear and side windows were to be about 6 to 7 feet from the floor, thus permitting shelving all around. The floor could be subdivided as desired by means of bookstacks.

2X. This one story, three bay, brick Classical Revival building has a rectangular plan, a high limestone foundation, and a shallow hip roof of standing seam metal. All sides of the building are three bays wide, which are demarcated by engaged fluted wood pilasters with Doric capitals, except for the west side, which has an exterior brick chimney in the place of one pilaster. The pilasters "support" a wide, plain cornice band beneath the widely overhanging eaves. The primary facade faces north. The main entrance is in the central bay, with stone steps leading to double, paneled wood doors with multi-light windows flanked by sidelights. The windows and

sidelights are separated by slender engaged columns with Ionic capitals. Above, a semi-elliptical fanlight window has decorative spandrels. The central bay of the other three sides has a tripartite window. All window openings have stone sills, flat arches of radiating brick voussoirs, and a stone keystone. The windows are double-hung, with a fixed transom above. There is a smooth stone sill separating the basement from the first story. A decorative iron fence encloses the small yard area between the sidewalk and the front of the building. The two front windows have iron rails on their lower portion.

2X. This one story, front-gabled "L" plan home has a front-facing gable intersecting with a side hip wing. It has a limestone foundation, asbestos shingle siding and a small, inset porch. It is nearly identical to 518 Isley. The porch's shallow shed roof is supported by three turned posts. The porch has newer, replacement steel railings and the steps to the porch have been replaced with a wheelchair ramp. The main entrance remains centered in the main facade.

T. The house was built c.1903 on land platted in 1898. The date of 1903 is an estimation based on the Sanborn Fire Insurance Maps. According to the 1900 Sanborn map, this home had not yet been built. The 1905 map does show this house, however. The Sanborn maps also indicate that sometime between 1913 and 1926 there was a small southwest (rear) addition and the home began use as a rooming house. The City Directories show Minor Payne at the address in 1917 and again as owner/occupant in 1922. The post-1933 "Official Map of Excelsior Springs" lists Mrs. M.E. Aldrich, rooming house, at the address and the 1940 phone book lists M.E. Aldrich.

2X. This $1\frac{1}{2}$ story home has a limestone foundation, asbestos shingle siding, and a complex roof formed by steeply pitched gable wall dormers intersecting on a steeply pitched trunacated hip roof over the main portion of the house. The full length porch has a low-pitched shed roof supported by five square posts. There are simple wooden porch railings. The steps to the porch are located slightly off center to the west. The three entrances are evenly spaced in the center of the main facade, separated and/or flanked by tall 1/1 double-hung windows. Non-historic storm doors partly obscure original wood doors with lower panels and a large upper fixed sash surrounded by small, colored-glass lights. The front gable wall dormer has a single, double hung window in its center. There is a long wooden staircase leading up to the second story on the west facade. Gable walls face west and east.

T. The building was built c.1909 on land platted in 1887. The date of 1909 is an estimation based on the Sanborn Fire Insurance Maps and a scrapbook of captioned photos called "Views of Excelsior Springs Missouri-The Park and Driveway System and Lands in the East, Southeast Section" stating that the Shelton opened in 1909. The 1905 Sanborn maps do not show this building, but the 1909 map does. According to the Sanborn Fire Insurance Maps, this building has not had any additions since 1909. The City Directories list The Shelton Apartments at the address in 1917 and again in 1922. However, the name appears to change by 1940. The 1940 phone book lists the building as Miller Manor, with Fred C. Pope and Carl T. Satterlee at the address.

2X. This three story, three bay Neoclassical apartment building has a limestone foundation, brick wall treatment and a flat roof. The tripletiered, full length porch has a flat roof with wide entablature supported by four large Tuscan columns. The porch and roof have wide, overhanging cornices, with wide entablatures having plain metope panels. There is a row of dentils under the roof eaves, and engaged pilasters enframe the corners of the third story. The porches have simple wood railings. The steps to the porch are centered on the main facade. There are three paired entry doors on the first floor, and two on the second. The central bay windows on the second and third stories have multi-diamond lights in the upper sash, as do the French doors accessing the porch for each unit.

Also, it should be noted that this home appears on the 1905 Sanborn map as a rooming house, indicating that unlike many other rooming houses in the area, this home was built for multi-family occupancy. According to the Sanborn Fire Insurance Maps, this home has not had any additions since 1905. The 1908 Excelsior Springs Blue Book lists the address as, Grey Gables, Cyrus Park, Prop. The City Directories list the Grey Gables, Mrs. M.E. Park and Jessie E. Park at the address in 1917 and simply "Grey Gables" in 1922. The post-1933 "Official Map of Excelsior Springs" lists the Grey Gables with 10 rooms renting for \$3.50 and up per week. The 1940 phone book lists Mrs. Ella Wharton at the address.

2X. This two story rectangular plan home has a limestone foundation, asbestos shingle siding, a hipped roof with gable wall dormers and a wraparound porch. The porch's hipped roof is supported by seven simple, classical columns. The porch has simple wooden railings. The steps to the porch are centrally located on the main facade, as is the main entrance. A small window is centered in the attic level of the front gable wall fishscale covered gable on the top story. Other gable walls face east and west. First and second story windows are flanked by shutters.

T. The house was built c.1896 on land platted in 1898. The date of 1896 is an estimation based partly on the style of the home, and on previous research done by local historian Sonya Morgan. According to the research and a photograph taken in 1899, this home was, for a short time, the dormitory for the Haynes Academy, a "Boarding School for Young Ladies." In an article published in the May, 1988 edition of the Excelsior Springs magazine <u>The Marketplace</u>, Morgan states the following:

> The school specialized in the classics, sciences, mathematics, bookkeeping, etc. for business, or for the higher classes in the University or Colleges.

> Young women who boarded at the academy were of a limited number. Only two pupils were allowed per room . . .

Parental care for the ladies' moral and physical development was stressed while warning that obedience to all orders and regulations necessary for the good of the school must be observed. Tuition during the first year was \$45 for enrollment in the academic department, \$30 for enrollment in the primary department, and \$200 for board, tuition, physical culture, with furnished room, fuel and light.

Morgan's research indicates that the school was probably owned by the Haynes family, as many Haynes' made up the teaching staff. However, the school does not appear to have lasted long. The 1905 Sanborn Fire Insurance Map shows the main school building, located next door to the west of 418 Broadway, as "Private School - to be removed" and the building does not appear on the 1909 map. By 1926, the Sanborn map shows this home as apartments. The City Directories show Stella Haynes and Cammie Haynes at the address in 1917 and Miss Stella Haynes as owner/occupant in 1922. A typed list called "Hotels - Apartments - Rooms" dated March 1, 1925, shows the Haynes Apartments with four rooms renting for \$7 per week.

2X. This two story, rectangular plan home has a limestone foundation, asbestos shingle siding, a shallow-pitched truncated hip roof and a full length porch. The porch's flat roof is supported by four square posts resting on limestone piers. The porch has simple, fence-like wood railings. Steps to the porch are centered on the main facade, as is the main entrance. A door is located in the central bay of the second story. Decorative brackets are spaced across the wide cornice band under the overhanging eaves.

2Y. Located on a small lot in a densely populated district among homes of similar construction.



Although the Sanborn maps do not show this home in 1909, its predecessor, a small one story, dwelling located closer to the street is shown. This newer house is shown on the 1913 map. According to the Sanborn Fire Insurance Maps, this home had its wrap-around porch added sometime between 1913 and 1926. Also, it is evident that the new home was built, set back from the road, because a soda spring had been discovered on the property. A pagoda was built near the street called the Natrona Soda Spring and the waters were sold from the site. The City Directories show the Natrona Soda Spring, Natrona Home, Jewel Davis at the address in 1917 and simply "Natrona Soda Spring" in 1922.

2X. This two story irregular plan home has a limestone foundation, weatherboard siding, a hipped roof and a wrap-around porch. The porch's hipped roof is supported by five simple, classical columns. The porch has simple wooden fence-like railings. The high porch foundation is supported by brick piers, which have infill panels between. The steps to the porch are located on the west facade, as is the main entrance. The windows are 1/1. There is a wide plain cornice band under the roof eaves, and a shed roof addition on the west.

The hotel was built c.1911 on land platted in 1887. The date of 1911 т. is an estimation based on the Sanborn Fire Insurance Maps. The 1900-1909 Sanborns do not show this building, although the 1900-1905 do show a pavilion structure for the Saratoga Springs located at what would be the southwest corner of the future hotel building. The present buildings appears on the 1913 Sanborn as the Hoffman Hotel. By the 1922 City Directory, it is listed as the Victoria Hotel. The c.1933 "Official Map of Excelsior Springs" lists the Victoria Hotel as having 12 rooms renting from \$3-\$6 per week. The 1926 Sanborn map show that this building had a large, one story addition to its southwest side which has recently been removed. A historic postcard shows the former front porch, which was a deep, fulllength, two-story porch. There were classical columns on both the first and second story, and the second story roof of the porch had a shallowpitched roof.

2X. This three story, three bay hotel building has a limestone foundation, brick walls and a flat, tar and gravel roof. There is evidence of a porch in the anchor holes seen just below the second story fenestration on the main facade. The light yellow brick walls were recently sandblasted to remove green paint. The main entrance is located in the center bay of the main facade. A two story tripartite bay with a flat roof is centered on the south facade. The third story, formerly wood shingles, is covered in vinyl siding. All windows are recent vinyl replacements, and three windows on the third floor of the main facade have multi-light sashes. The interior was completely gutted except for the staircase in the current renovation project, which is attempting to provide housing for the homeless. The hotel, formerly Classical Revival in its architectural detailing, still retains brackets and dentils on the cornice area under the wide, overhanging roof eves.



The same basic footprint remains for nearly fifty years, but the addition. building's height apparently is altered. In 1905 it remains listed as a one-story dwelling, but in 1909 and 1913, the same footprint appears for a $1\frac{1}{2}$ story house (the present building might be considered by some to be $1\frac{1}{2}$ stories). The porch steps are centrally located, as is the main entrance, which is flanked by sidelights. There is a 1/1, double-hung window on both sides of the entry door with wood plank shutters. The second story has a door in the central bay, flanked by two windows. Two shed roofed dormers with paired double hung windows are located on the outer bays of the main facade. 
