

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## Doomed building tull of history

NIXA — There's a lot of history packed into the red brick garage on Mount Vernon near Main here that isn't apparent from the outside or inside of the structure, packed with supplies for a plastics firm.

Now used for storage and slated for demolition in the near future, the building was the site of several "firsts."

Built about 1919, it is said to have been the first automobile repair garage in southwest Missouri south of Springfield. In later years it housed a cheese plant that produced more cheddar cheese than anywhere else in the world at the time. And still later, it was the first place in the country where alcohol was made from whey, a byproduct of cheesemaking.

For L.D. McCroskey, who has lived here all his life and owns Nixa Hardware with his son Larry and son-in-law Gary Murray, it seems fitting that when the building is demolished the land it sits on will return to its first role of parking lot.

The garage, once owned by the hard-

ware store, recently was purchased from Diversified Plastics, McCroskey said. The building will be razed to provide parking space for store customers.

McCroskey, who is retired but can be found most days at the hardware store, said his early memories of Nixa include seeing farmer's wagons parked near the town well next to where the garage now stands. "I can still remember the water tanks and a windmill," he said.

By the mid-1920s, a corner of the garage had been taken over by a cheesemaking cooperative founded by several dairy farmers. Progress was stunted by the Depression, when the plant was purchased by Wilson and Co. and renamed Blackwell Cheese.

McCroskey, whose fortunes also ebbed during the Depression — "I planted corn one year on 55 acres and made \$55," he said — went to work at the hardware store and later became a partner.

Most businesses in Nixa benefitted from the cheese plant, including the hardware store. That's where cheese factory workers bought paint to mark the milk cans brought in by farmers, he said.

At the height of its operation, the cheese plant had deliveries from as far away as Ava, Aurora, Reeds Spring and Pleasant Hope, with nearly 40 routes in all. By 1940, the plant took in 42 million pounds of milk a year, and produced 4 million pounds of cheese.

Whey resulting from cheesemaking first was discarded, but the discovery that alcohol was being produced in the discarded whey resulted in the establishment of an alcohol and vinegar plant behind the cheese factory.

The alcohol plant, in operation from 1938 to 1959, was the first plant in the nation to use whey to produce alcohol.

Activity at the plants gained so much interest at the time that the operations were described in the Christian Science Monitor and the Saturday Evening Post. It also was the object of criticism, in the form of a letter from the Women's Christian Temperance Union, complaining of the fact that milk was being used to make alcohol, McCroskey said.

"They just started fermenting whey

there as an experiment," said Max Smith, whey plant manager from 1956 until the plant closed. "There was quite a bit of alcohol going down the drain and causing a lot of odor problems, so they decided to recover the alcohol and build a vinegar plant," he said.

Smith said the milk sugar — lactose — in the whey was fermented by mixing a gallon of whey with a patented yeast sent from a Kraft Foods laboratory in Baltimore. The first gallon was used to ferment larger batches, resulting in 120-proof alcohol, he said.

By distilling the alcohol further in a whiskey still, the end product was 170-proof grain alcohol, Smith said. The solid byproduct later was used for stock feed, he said.

Since the alcohol could be drunk, security at the plant was tight, with federal inspectors on duty 24 hours, he said. But there never was a problem with employees trying to get samples, since only teetotalers were hired and because all the valves and fittings were protected with locks, he said.

The alcohol didn't stay drinkable for long, White said. After it was tested and denatured, it was pumped to the tops of large wooden tanks — still used in the vinegar plant operated by Consolidated Brands — and trickled through beechwood shavings, he said. Bacterial action in the shavings converted the alcohol into 12 percent acetic acid, later diluted into household vinegar, he said.

It all came to an end in 1961 — except for the vinegar plant, its pungent

odor still pervading the air in downtown Nixa — because of plant consolidations, said Freeman Glenn, the last manager at the cheese plant.

When the building is torn down, all that will be left are memories and some history. But the land will return to its original use, something that seems fitting to McCroskey. "What was that in the Bible," he asked while walking around the brick building. "Ashes to ashes, and dust to dust?"
