#### **OBJECTIVE:**

Phase II of the thematic architectural/historical survey of St. Louis churches continues a comprehensive survey of citywide churches which, at conclusion, will develop criteria for determining eligibility for listing churches in the National Register, following National Register Criteria for Evaluation. While Phase I focused only on identification and inventory of 19th century churches, Phase II will extend the period of significance to 1955. Phase II survey area covers approximately 16,000 acres on the city's south side where 90 churches will be inventoried; an inventory data sheet with at least one 5" X 7" photograph will be prepared for each property.

The interim report will continue to develop eligibility criteria suggested in the Phase I Final Report, including physical integrity, age, location, denomination or ethnic group, and design of the buildings. The report will also provide a master list of inventoried 'churches which states original and current name, address and city block number, date of construction, basic building materials, and style. A map will be prepared showing the location of each inventoried property. A research design for Phase III will be included in the report which will outline the most expeditious method for completing the survey and begin to formulate the research questions needed to evaluate St.Louis churches.

#### METHODOLGY:

Phase II proposes to significantly improve upon the efficiency of Phase I survey methods by extending the period of significance to 1955. Thus, repetitious mileage will be eliminated which otherwise would be unavoidable if more restricted chronological periods were undertaken, requiring traveling throughout the city in each successive survey phase. By designing Phase II as an inclusive and comprehensive approach, research time will also be saved since Sanborn maps and building permits for each section of the city will need to be reviewed only once. The Phase II survey will begin at the southern city limits and systematically sweep north (following Sanborn volume boundaries) until 90 properties have been inventoried. Before field work begins, each Sanborn volume will be reviewed page by page, noting every building identified as a church or mission which has not previously been inventoried. Using this Sanborn master list, field work will proceed with a site visit to each church building noted, and if the property retains sufficient integrity, it will be inventoried. Next, research activities will be undertaken to determine date of construction and original congregation; this process will involve examining building permits, and consulting city directories, local histories, and current owners.

### EXPECTED RESULTS:

It is anticipated that very few, if any, pre-1900 churches will be identified since Phase I attempted to inventory all churches built before 1900. However, a large group of early 20th century churches which are closely related to late-19th century design traditions is expected. Although Gothic and Romanesque will continue to dominate stylistically, by the 1920s notable changes are expected within these broad style categories following national trends in church design. Because of the long building period of more than 50 years, and the large sample of churches scattered in an area covering approximately half of the city, it is expected that Phase II results will provide a substantial data base and valuable overview/framework for understanding and evaluating future phases of the St. Louis church survey.
