



offered every possible encouragement to borrowers, and the ease with which money could be obtained to pay for land at the western offices, caused vast sums to be invested in this way. The wildest excitement in land speculation ever known in the history of the country sprang up and raged until President Jackson issued his famous specie circular in 1836, requiring lands to be paid for in coin. Then the bills of the "wild cat" banks were sent in for redemption, the banks went down, and the crash of 1837 came, precipitating financial ruin and depression from which the country did not recover for a number of years.

During this fever of land speculation the first great tide of immigration settled in Missouri. Nearly all those who came prior to 1840 located along the creeks in the timber. About 1840 the settlers began to locate on the prairies near the timber, for reasons given elsewhere. No farms were opened any distance from the timber until 1855 or

'56, when land speculation again sprang up.

The act creating Benton County bears date January 3rd, 1835. The first commission appointed to locate the county seat having failed, a second commission was appointed by the legislature in 1837. Fristoe was already a town and its rival was New Town, Log Town, Bristoe, or Osage. Both were small trading places and very ambitious to secure the coveted prize. Their respective claims were so evenly balanced that both were rejected and the commissioners selected the place where Warsaw now stands. The rivals then petitioned to locate the county seat half

That shop was the start of a long family tradition; his sons later operated the Ahrens Bros. shoe and clothing shop on N. Maple Street. (#56.)

History, cont.

John Ahrens is listed as a shoemaker in the 1876, 1879-80, and 1889-90 <u>Gazeteers</u>. The listing expanded to "John Ahrens and Son" for the 1898-99 issue, which was printed just two years before his death. By 1909 "Ahrens Bros and Co." had been granted a merchant's license for their store in #56, at which time they had \$8,000 worth of stock.

1890s, and his son Oscar H. Fajen carried on the business into the middle part of the twentieth century. Oscar Fajen bought the building in 1928, and his widow Emma Fajen, owned it into the 1970s. The Fajens lived in #253.

Ad ad for the store which ran in an 1898 issue of the Cole Camp Courier read: "DON'T FAIL TO CALL AT MY STORE IN OLDTOWN, when in town, to see what I have and to learn my prices....YOU CAN ALWAYS GET SOMETHING YOU WANT......Call and see me. H. G. FAJEN."

This building is unusual for the survey group in that it is a commercial building with a residence attached to the side of it. Early photos show that Grother's original drug store was a frame building which sat in front of the house part of this building.

quarter's worth of beans." It is not remembered what that translated to in pounds, or if I ever knew. That is just the way they were sold then.

Another interesting item for boys was the box of salt herrings. These dried fish must have been about one-fourth salt, but every boy wanted one in his pocket in order to try to sneak a bite when in class at school.

Oscar always had a glass container on the counter with sticks of striped candy, with a sign that read, "10 for 10 cents." I couldn't figure why it didn't read "1 cent each" until much later when I realized people would be more likely to buy ten of them instead of just one.

Probably the most significant thing about Oscar was his exactness in filling an order - an old tradition handed down through the years by the Cole Camp merchants. He would carefully count each item as he filled your list and place them in neat rows. Then, as he made out the sales slip, he would carefully shift each item into another row. The final count was made again when each item was carefully placed in your grocery sack or box.

The stone for the walls is local. It was quarried at a location about 1 and 1/2 miles south of Cole Camp, on "Slaughter House Road." That quarry provided stone for many of the stone-faced buildings in Cole Camp. It has since been filled with water and no longer serves as a quarry.

probably made the swap to be close to his job as the assistant cashier at the People's Bank, on Maple Street, (#49) and to give his new bride better access to town life. (He married Susun Page on July 3, 1910.) The same article noted that the house "is one of Cole Camp's modern homes. It was built for comfort as well as for service and appearance."

Whatever the reasons, Muller must have decided he missed farming, as four years later the paper announced that "The Muller families have exchanged residences, Mr. Ed Muller moving his family to his father's farm in the country, and Mr. and Mrs Gerd Muller moving to Ed's beautiful home in town..." and that Ed Muller would "continue to raise the big fat cattle and mules" for which his father's farm was noted. (Cole Camp Courier, July 1, 1915.)





longest lasting druggist was Lymand Demand, who ran a drug store there from 1919-1964. Mr. Demand was the first owner of survey property #84, which is just down Boonville road from this building. That building was built about ten years after he took over the drug store business, and remained his home into the 1940s or later.

The Demand store as it functioned in the 1920s and 30s was described by Jaunita Jeffries "Besides prescriptions and over the counter medicines, he had sundries and also had a soda fountain. This was more of a hang out for adults and the sophisticated citizens of Cole Camp. Upstairs, in the back, was a balcony where they had chairs and tables for customers to enjoy their refreshments." (p. 16.)





n the early 1800's the roads in Benton County, juri were merely trails. In our Ozarks these trails 'ed the ridges away from the hills and creeks while prairies a more direct route would be taken to om places. Thus travelers had the inconvenience ening and closing many gates as they passed gh property owned by others.

Slowly the public roads began to be establ the first in 1818, known as the old Military Ro came into Cole Camp from the north and then fol a southwesterly direction through the local are came out on what is now U.S. Highway 65, just what is known as the Rock Hill Station which is of Warsaw, Missouri. Much later this road was join

his grandson, Edward Leon, also known as E. L., operates the store today. Henry Eickhhoff operated his business out of a pair of buildings in the 100 block of N. Maple which are also still standing. (#53 and #54.)

Construction of the building, which was part of a block of three, was covered several times in the local paper. An article which appeared in May 26, 1898 noted that "ground was broken for three new brick store buildings last week....Kieffer and Lauchlan have the contracts for these buildings and the brick is now being made at their brickyard west of town." The article was referring to this block of buildings. The eaternmost of the orignal three has since been demolished; the other two are #68 and #69.

The "Lauchlan" of Kieffer and Lauchlan was presumably M. A. Lauchlan, who was referred to in an earlier paper as "our brick maker." Several of the commercial buildings in town, including the buildings mentioned above, feature ornate brick cornices which may be Lauchlan's handiwork. One of the more elaborate and most intact examples of such a cornice can be found on the buildings across the street from this one, at 105 and 107 E. Main St. (#s 71-72).

The Citizens Bank was chartered in 1893, with a capitalization of \$11,000. The first building for the bank was a frame structure on S. Maple. The current building was built in 1898 and has been in use as a bank ever since. In 1929 the Citizens Bank and the Farmers Bank were consolidated under a new charter, to become the Citizens-Farmers Bank. It continues to operate under that name today.






Interior of The Citizens Bank taken in 1923-Wright Freund, Claus Junge, Oliver Junge and Edgar Schwald.

The people of the Cole Camp area felt another bank was needed in the growing community. The Peoples Bank was chartered March 1, 1906, as number 1439. The first president was Peter Holsten; vicepresident: John Jagels; and cashier: W.C. Nelson. The original capitalization was \$15,000. A new brick building was built directly across Maple Street from The Citizens Bank.



of the world. There would be singing, food, and a lot of socializing, as well as preaching and taking collections for mission work.


Cole Campers have always been extremely patriotic. They enthusiastically volunteered for the Home Guard and regular Union forces during the Civil War. Likewise, there was no hesitation when the call came to serve in World War I. These people were truly grateful to their chosen homeland for all it had given them. Thus, the Fourth of July was a very special day in the community.

These were traditional American celebrations and a clear statement of the commitment to their chosen homeland. Bands, parades, fireworks, picnics, balloons, and all that went with celebrating the nation were clearly in evidence. In town it was traditional for the parade, and all the towns people, to march down to meet the train when it came in.

The fall brought the harvest and the end of the farming season. It was a natural time to relax and reflect. It was a natural time for a community fair where people could show-off



the second floor, which was used primarily as a meeting hall. It was referred to as Eickhoff's Hall. The second floor was also the meeting placeof the United Lutheran Church in the mid-1920s. The 1913 Sanborn map refers to the second floor of both spaces as an Opera House in 1913, and notes the existence of electric lights, a stage and scenery. The 1930 Sanborn simply says it is a dance hall.

There is an interesting first-hand account of dances here which was written by Jaunita Jeffries, who spent her childhood in Cole Camp in the 1920s and 30s. She wrote: "Upstairs was the exciting place where they had a dance hall. They had great dance bands, and this was the place to be. In order to strengthen the building on nights when they had a dance large posts would be put on the first floor, and against the ceiling so the upstairs would hold the crowd of dancers." (Jeffries account p. 20.)

Woodworking products of the ground floor included wagon spokes, ax handles, gun stocks, and millwork for houses, such as porch posts and other trim. Henry Eickhoff, and later his son and grandson, used large turning lathes for much of his work.

Henry Eickhoff started his business as a spinning wheel maker in the original part of town (# 181), and was in a building across the street from this one before moving to this location. He was partners in that shop with William Beckman, who later opened a furniture business in survey property #69 on Second Street. Beckman's Second Street building was purchased by Henry Eickhoff around 1909, and remains in his family yet today.



was referred to in an earlier paper as "our brick maker." The Cole Camp Courier in 1898 (May 26) also noted that Kieffer and Lauchlan had a brickyard and made the bricks for the above mentioned projects. George Kieffer was also on the board of directors for the Citiezens Bank in the 1920s.

The business name of "Lumber and Lime" indicates that their operation was also supplying lime and other building materials for the many brick business buildings which were erected in Cole Camp around the turn of the century.

Kieffer and Gallie operated at this location until 1921, when it was sold to Fred J. and Albert Eickhoff, who operated the Home Lumber Co. here. It stayed in the Eickhoff family for the next 46 years.







It became the property of C. P. (Pete) Michaelis sometime between 1895 and 1910, and appears to have funtioned more as a boarding house or apartment building after that. It is labeled simply as a dwelling in both the 1913 and 1930 Sanborn maps.

It is described in an account of Cole Camp life of the 1920s and 30s which was recently written by Jaunita Jeffries, who lived on the ground floor there in the early 1920s with her grandmother. At that time, the Michalis family occupied the rest of the ground floor and Les (C. L.) and Laura Parks lived upstairs with their son Randall. Les Parks opened a confectionary business in a now demolished building on Main Street around the turn of the century, and by the 1920s was operaterating a produce business in what is now the very west end of the Mill building at the north end of Maple Street. (#48.) Laura Parks was the daughter of Mrs. Michaelis.



One day a local woman went shopping, taking her little daughter with her. The lady made her purchases and, as was customary in those less hurried days, remained to talk a bit with the clerk. Just as she was ready to leave, her daughter asked the clerk, "Wo wascht ji de Han'n? Ik heff mit de Swetschen speelt, un ik mutt mien Han'n waschen!" (Where do you wash your hands? I've been playing with the prunes, and I must wash my hands!)

Now that we have taken a look at our beginnings, let's take a look at what still remains, to give us a thread connecting us to the kind of businessmen that built our town. We started in what we now refer to as "Old Town." Is "Old Town" dead? Not yet. A few were slow to give up their claim to the location. In fact some have not given up yet.

John Stadtherr held on to his claim and location in "Old Town" until he was no longer able to continue his vocation. He was of the "old school" that didn't subscribe to the idea of re-

Indicated that Grother also sold hardware items such as paints, oils, and wall paper.

The building is best known as the Belleview Hotel, a name it may have taken when Pete Toababen took it over in the late 1920s. It was labeled as the Belleview Hotel in the 1930 Sanborn.

Ms. Juanita Jeffries' account includes very good descriptions of life at the Bellview Hotel. She wrote: "The old Bellview Hotel was a hub of activity. It was the place where all the drummers—traveling salesman—stayed, along with the entire Tobaben clan who lived there also. The proprietor was Pete Tobaben....." (pp 3-5)





The grocery store was run by Dick Muller and later his widow Mary Lotz Muller. It remained in the Muller family past 1915.

Sometime in the 1920s, the property passed into the hands of J. H. and Gladys Frederich. (They are shown as the owners on the ca. 1927 property map, and appear in 1925 and 1930 tax records.) It has been assumed that the Frederichs remodeled the house when they bought it, and added the Craftsman style porch on the building today. They also built the gas station next door (survey # 67) which is very similar to the porch in styling and construction materials.


