# **ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:**

26. (con't) Description of Environment and Outbuildings.

The property has a one-story, front gabled shed facing 4<sup>th</sup> Street/ Highway N south of the main building, which was originally used as a doctor's examination room. A one-story garage is found at the southeast corner of the property, and another one-story gabled shed is found at the northeast corner of the property.

28. (con't) Further Description of important architectural features.

A two-story frame cross gabled residence clad in vinyl siding and sitting on a stone foundation. Two 2/2 sash windows are found to the north of the central wood entrance door with glass transom. The fenestration pattern is mimiced on the second level, with a cross gable featuring fish scale shingles above the windows. A cross gabled projection is found to the south of the entrance, featuring two 2/2 sash windows on each level. The building was divided into two dwellings at one point, and the rear of the building mirrors the design of the main façade. Though covered in siding, the building was restored in 1987 to resemble a 1920s photograph. The colonial revival detailing has been well preserved.

38. (con't) History and Significance.

The main building was constructed by a Missouri born physician and surgeon named Herman Baltzer in 1892, with his examination room located at the southwest corner of the property. A brick summer kitchen was constructed behind the home, but has been demolished. Baltzer was the son of German immigrants: the Evengelical Friedens Church minister, Adolph Baltzer, and Louisa Van Laer. Herman was born June 7, 1851, and after growing up in St. Charles County, studied at the University of Berlin and Wuerzburg University in Germany. After graduation in 1875, Herman married Eva Hartman and set up his practive in Cottleville. He later became clerk of the school board.





26. (con't) Description of Environment and Outbuildings. N/A

28. (con't) Further Description of important architectural features.

One-story, brick side-gable residence clad in vinyl siding and sitting on a concrete foundation. A modern glass and metal door entrance is located off center below a cloth awning, with 1/1 metal sash windows filling the remaining three bays. Building was originally brick and has been sided since construction. A handicap accessible ramp has been added to the façade for commercial use.

38. (con't) History and Significance.

Tax records indicate that the building was constructed between 1880 and 1885 by John Schmidt. It passed to William Schmidt, a priest, by 1896 and later to Louis and Herman Schmidt, German farmers from Illinois. The building is reflected on the 1905 plot map, and is representative of the German Vernacular form, though it has been altered for commercial use.



26. (con't) Description of Environment and Outbuildings.

A two-story brick office building was constructed east of the main building in 1999. This building is not connected to the original building, and faces St. Charles Street instead of 4<sup>th</sup> Street/ Highway N.

28. (con't) Further Description of important architectural features.

One-story, brick, side gabled, german vernacular residence sitting on a stone foundation. The façade consists of four bays, with modern 1/1 sash windows in the outter bays. The northern central bay contains a new metal door with a glass transom, and the southern central bay has been bricked in. Each bay is accented by a segmental arched brick lintel. Evidence of an open porch can be seen in the brick over the central bays, but a concrete stoop is all that remains.

38. (con't) History and Significance.

An example of one of Cottleville's earliest residential buildings, and one of the most intact. The building's brick facing has not been covered, as many of the brick buildings in the city have, and it continues to reflect the German vernacular architectural patterns common in St. Charles County in the late 19<sup>th</sup> and early 20<sup>th</sup> centuries. Tax records show that the building was most likely constructed between 1885 and 1900 by Casper Landold, an the builing is reflected on the 1905 plot map.



26. (con't) Description of Environment and Outbuildings. A detached, one-story vinyl sided garage with metal roof sits to the north of the main building.

28. (con't) Further Description of important architectural features.

Two-story, frame, side gabled I-House clad in wood siding, and sitting on a concrete foundation. Two 2/2 sash windows are found on either side of the central metal door. The second level features the same windows in all five bays, with an air conditioner found in the fourth bay. The front gabled open porch features classical columns.

38. (con't) History and Significance.

The property was part of a large plot of land owned by David K. Pitman during the 19<sup>th</sup> Century. He divided the property, and by 1880 the lot was sold to John Rupp, a German road developer who came to the United States in 1847. The property passed to his wife, and tax records indicate that she made a substantial change to the property between 1890 and 1896. This change was most likely the constuction of the house that remains on the property. By 1905 the property was owned by Amanda Hillenkemp, a Missouri native of German decent.





26. (con't) Description of Environment and Outbuildings.

1 bay metal garage with metal roof located on the north side of main building. The main building sits on a half lot, which was divided historically but is not reflected in current Assessor's office information.

28. (con't) Further Description of important a chitectural features.

One-and-a-half-story, frame, gable front residence clad in wood siding and sitting on a concrete foundation. A 3/1 wood sash window is found on either side of the of the central entrance door. The open porch features some Victorian detailing.

38. (con't) History and Significance.

The building sits on land historically owned by David K. Pitman. The land was divided in the mid 1800s, and sold to a German woman named Catherine Roth by 1880. She married J. H. Laudermeyer, and the two retained the property until the second decade of the 20<sup>th</sup> century, when it was sold to Michael Himming. Though the assessors records date the building to 1920, a construct of similar size appears on the 1905 plot map.





26. (con't) Description of Environment and Outbuildings.

An unattached six-bay, side gabled, metal garage is located north of the main building, set back from the road with a concrete drive in front. A rear, metal utility shed is located behind the main building, unseen from the street.

28. (con't) Further Description of important architectural features.

One and a half story, frame side-gable hall and parlor residence clad in vinyl siding and sitting on a stone foundation. The asymmetrical façade features an off center door below a gabled portico, with a single 6/6 sash window in the northern bay and a three part bay window in the southern bay. Two front gabled dormers with sash windows break the roofline. The façade has been covered in siding and painted and the windows have been replaced, but the fenestration pattern remains fairly intact with the exception of a three part bay window added to the main façade in the last 10 years. It is possible a second door existed under the porch.

38. (con't) History and Significance.

The property was owned by David K. Pitman during the 19<sup>th</sup> century. In the last decades of the 1800 he subdivided the property, and by 1880 it was owned by H.H. Sermen. By 1885 the property was sold to George Kohlepp. Kohlepp was a cabinet maker and carpenter who was born in Missouri to German immigrants. He held the property for the next few decades, and records show that his taxes doubled between 1890 and 1896, which most likely accompanied the construction of the residential building located on the property.

38. (con't) History and Significance.

Cottleville's history as a town begins with the occupation of Warren Cottle, Sr. on a plot near Dardeen Creek, obtained through Spanish land grants. Together with his sons, Warren and Ira, Cottle began a grist mill on Dardenne Creek in 1799. Cottle's grist mill used water power to sift and grind wheat, oats, and other products. The water method proved to be superior to the other horse powered mills found within the county, and many people from around the area began to bring their harvested crops to Cottle's mill. Over the next decade, the large number of customers encouraged the establishment of small shops and lodges to accomodate those waiting, sometimes overnight, for their turn at the mill.

The 1938 building is reletively intact, and features a central projection with brick quoining and a double metal door entrance with sidlights. The words "St. Joseph's School" are carved into a stone name plate above the door. The windows on the façade were replaced in 1970, with an air conditioning unit and fire alarm filling the central bays of the raised basement. Later school buildings are much larger than the original building, but do not dramatically impact it's architecture, connected only on the basement level at the rear of the original building.

The interior consisted primarily of open space on the first and second levels, divided by removable partition walls. It was to be used in conjunction with the old school building. In the late 1980s plans were drawn for an addition to the school building, constructed to the south of the 1970 building. The construction was completed in the last 10 years.

The original 1938 school building is reletively intact, and connected to the 1970 building by a connection in the basement at the rear of the builing. The glass façade of the 1970 addition features multicolored brick pillars and with two sets of paired metal and glass door located below grade, and one set at grade. The windows and doors feature square fixed pane transom windows. The more recent addition is located to the south of the 1970 building and features red brick with metal windows.

38. (con't) History and Significance.

St. Joseph's parish formed in 1863, and grew with the community of Cottleville. The first parish building was a farm house donated by Thomas Croft, which housed the priest as well as acting as a church. The land on which the parish buildings now sit was sold to the parish by David K. Pitman in 1864. The first school classes were held in 1872 in the Croft house, and after its conversion to a convent and school in the early 1930s, classes were held in the 1874 church building. The present school was constructed in 1938 for \$14,000, with 3 classrooms, an open hall that seated 325, a basement kitchen, open cafeteria, and garage for school buses. In 1970 a new, 2-story building was constructed to the east of the school for \$290,000. The interior consisted primarily of open space on the first and second levels, divided by removable partition walls. It was to be used in conjunction with the old school building. In the late 1980s plans were drawn for an addition to the school building, constructed to the south of the 1970 building. The construction was completed in the last 10 years.
