Missouri State Parks has received a \$13,000 grant through the federal Historic Preservation Fund. The First Missouri State Capitol State Historic Site will use the grant to conduct a geophysical archaeological survey of the backyard.

This notice serves to make the public aware of the project and solicit comments pursuant to Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act and the National Environmental Policy Act. The National Historic Preservation Act of 1966 authorizes a program of federal matching grants, known as the Historic Preservation Fund, to assist the various states in carrying out historic preservation activities. The program is sponsored by the U.S. Department of the Interior, National Park Service, and in Missouri, is administered through the Department of Natural Resources' State Historic Preservation Office.
