


History and Significance A steel viaduct for cable cars was constructed in 1887 in order to provide an improved means of transportation between the downtown area and the Central Industrial District. 



In 1912, as business increased, they purchased the building at this location that was occupied by the Kingman-Moore Implement Co. The present building was erected by the company in 1913/14. Spices were made on the fifth floor. All of the coffees handled by the firm were roasted, blended and ground on the seventh floor.

He came to Kansas City in 1857, invested heavily in business property and became the largest land owner in the city. He had this building erected in 1887/88. A number of agricultural implement dealers were located in this building including the Grand DeTour Plow Co.; Acme Harvester Co.; and the Pekin Plow Co.

Some windows on the east side of the building have been bricked in. A decorative cornice has been removed.

Charles Campbell, an Illinois native, came to Kansas City in 1879 and established the Campbell Glass and Paint Co. By 1913 the firm had branches in five southwest cities. Campbell served on the Park Board and was president of the 1900 Convention Hall Building Company. In addition to their paint products, the company also crafted stained and jeweled glass windows.


