

42 Further Description of Important Features The building has been dramatically altered through the application of wooden shake shingles as a veneer on the first story. The second story retains much of its integrity, and contains a series of double hung rectangular windows that are set within round arch frames. The cornice provides a major decorative feature, and it contains a dentiled brick molding. The dentils create a dramatic shadow pattern across the length of the facade.

43. History and Significance In 1903 this was known as the Bishop Building and was occupied by the barber shop of Augustus Bishop. Other tenants at the turn of the century were the Thomas Kinney Meat Market and the Christopher Geib harness shop. Geib came to Liberty around 1877 and was probably one of the 1st tenants of this building. In the 1920's the building housed the Ward Shoe Store.





- 43. Peter McDuff, a Scottish immigrant whochad also designed courthouses for Clinton and Platte counties. McDuff's design, featured an X-shaped plan with a sheltering portico across its main facade. The building terminated in a colonnaded cylindrical drum which carried a dome with a figure of Justice perched above. In 1934 amidst the fervor of new governmental building construction inspired by the Public Works Administration, Clay County approved \$200,000 worth of bonds to construct a new courthouse, feeling that the 1857 building had become obsolescent. Prominent Kansas City architects Wight & Wight (whose designs included the Nelson-Atkins Museum of Art in Kansas City,) won the commission for the building with a very "modern" design which won over the more traditional concepts which had been presented. The building, with its sleek limestone facade and minimum surface ornamentation, reflects the larger trends then current, which featured the Art Deco and Art Moderne styles.

43. while the third floor windows are much shorter, leading to the conclusion that the 3rd floor was added. Sources indicate that a building occupied this site as early as 1866. In 1867 Adkins and Roberts operated a grocery in Liberty and in 1867 the Commercial Bank of Liberty opened for business on the southwest corner of the square. In 1873 R.S. Adkins operated a general mercantile store on the southwest corner of the square, and D.J. Adkins was serving as President of the Commercial Saving Bank.

Therefore, these sources lead us to date the building c. 1865, the date around which the first known building occupied this site. However, the subsequent alterations and additions have obscured all traces of the original architecture.

By 1884 this building was the site of a grocery store operated by Judson Cockrell. Cockrell, a William Jewell College graduate, sold his grocery business in 1888 to John and Herman Fischer.
