Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

The McKinley Fox District, located on St. Louis' south side, is a late nineteenth and early twentieth century working-class neighborhood. The District's street plan follows a slightly irregular grid pattern laid out at the time the original subdivisions were platted between 1848 and 1869. Nearly 90% of the District's almost 560 buildings are residential. Two-story, three or four bay, red brick multi-family units predominate. Most buildings were constructed during the years 1900-1915, although construction dates range from circa 1865 to 1931. The houses are of a similar scale, size, material and color--elements which provide unity. Throughout the eastern half of the District, corner businesses combine second-story residential function with first-floor commercial use. Institutional buildings include three churches, all active, and three public schools. McKinley High School and the Franz Sigel School (kindergarten through grade five) are still open; Charless School is presently closed. Two commercial strips bound the District, one extending along Jefferson and the other along Gravois. Manufacturing operations exist at the Joseph Lipic Pen Company in the former Bell Telephone Exchange building, 2001 Indiana, and the Shampaine Hospital Products plant in the former United Railways building at 1900-30 Jefferson.

The majority of the buildings in the District are in good or excellent condition. The most commonly deteriorated portions of buildings in McKinley Fox are those made of wood, such as cornices and rear porches. The most frequent alterations have occurred on store fronts (Photos #14, 17, 64) and to porches on residential buildings (Photos #33; 60). Streetscapes within the District remain intact in large part. Those areas with lower structural density are primarily around the edges of the McKinley Fox District.

All non-contributing buildings are designated on the Architectural Survey Map with an asterisk. Those deemed non-contributing are buildings less than fifty years old which do not meet National Register criteria (Photos #3, 4, & 5), marginal sheds and garages, and historic buildings with new facades (Photo #14, right).

Contributing buildings are color coded on the Architectural Survey Map under six classifications (often overlapping) based on style (Urban Vernacular Classicism, Mansard/Italianate and Late Nineteenth Century Revival) and type (Twentieth Century Flat, Commercial/Warehouse); a miscellaneous group includes pivotal institutional buildings and a few contributing garages and stables.

Urban Vernacular Classicism, circa 1865-1905 (coded red)

This category represents the earliest of McKinley Fox's buildings. Constructed of red brick (with two exceptions, noted later), often having dormered gabled roofs, these buildings are one to two stories tall and two to five bays wide. In a few instances, they are semi-detached; most are detached. The most common example has two stories, a stone foundation, and is three bays wide. Windows are headed with brick segmental arches; most buildings employ brick dentilling, but wood cornices with modillions are not uncommon. Original roofing of wood shingles has all been replaced, usually with rolled asphalt roofing. The larger, two-story versions of this category appear to have been intended for multi-family use; access to upper-story units is gained most often by rear wood exterior stairs, and less often through a second front door. The smallest versions, known as Flounder houses, are one and one-half story houses "cut in half" vertically (Photos #6 and 7). Two small frame houses indicated on the Architectural Survey Map with slashed red and orange for both the unusual material and the style are the remaining examples in the District of a simple vernacular building tradition

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of which little remains in the city. Representative examples of Urban Vernacular Classicism may be seen in Photos #6 through 12.

Mansard/Italianate, circa 1880-1910 (coded green)

The mansard roof came into its own in this District during the period 1885-1895 at the height of its popularity in St. Louis' working-class neighborhoods. Since Italianate characteristics are often present on mansarded buildings and rarely alone, the two styles have been coded together. Italianate characteristics most often present are arched openings and heavy bracketed wood or corbeled brick cornices. Most buildings are two stories high, but there are a few three-story and one-story Mansards. Gray slate is the most common roofing material, although a few Mansards boast polychrome patterns and a few have been redone with modern materials. The buildings are especially prevalent in the northern and southwestern areas of the District, although Mansards can be found scattered throughout. Upper-story flats are usually reached through a second front door and interior stairs; a few have rear exterior wood stairs. Toward the end of the century, mansarded buildings began to appear with late Victorian features such as pierced wood cornices, decorative terra cotta or pressed brick panels in the friezes, and elaborately scrolled wood trim. Representative examples of the Mansard/Italianate style may be seen in Photos #13 through #21.

Late Nineteenth Century Revival, circa 1888-1912 (coded pink)

Toward the end of the nineteenth century, many District builders began to include a wider variety of elements in their designs based on new revival styles popular at the time such as the Queen Anne, Romanesque, and Georgian Colonial/Renaissance. With a few exceptions, the styles are expressed principally in detailing such as window and dormer treatment, roof forms, and ornament; often different stylistic motifs are combined on the same building. Typical new features include broad-arched openings, small towers or turrets with conical or pyramid roofs, corbiestepped, gambrel or hipped roofs, dormers with diamond or gothic paned windows, terra cotta medallions and friezes, decorative iron grillwork and projecting front porches. Early evidence of the new fashions can be found in 1880's Mansard Style buildings which attempt picturesque effects through elaborate dormer designs and/or slightly projecting bays which break the planar facades (Photos #10, center, #21, left). More fully developed expressions of the Queen Anne and Romanesque modes are illustrated in the few large houses of the period which display irregular massing and complex roof forms in addition to new detailing (Foreground in Photos #22, 24, 25, 26). By the turn of the century, many houses introduced Georgian Colonial/Renaissance detailing while retaining picturesque roof lines with projecting towers or gables (Photos #26, 27, 28). The Georgian Colonial/Renaissance style became by far the most popular of the Revival styles during the first decade or so of the twentieth century, although Romanesque, Tudor, and Gothic elements were sometimes employed on the same building to create what newspaper advertisements referred to as a "mixed style." Among the new features of the early twentieth century Georgian Colonial house are projecting front porches (often classically detailed) and gabled or hipped "pseudo-roofs"

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on front elevations which mask the flat roofs (Photos #29, 30). Occasionally, true hipped or gambrel roofs are employed (Photos #31, 32, 33). Two or two and one-half stories tall, most of these houses were intended for two families. Upper-story units are almost universally reached by interior stairs entered through a second front door, unlike many earlier buildings. Most often, two to four bays wide, they tend to be sized to a slightly larger scale than earlier buildings in the District. Other representative examples of Revival Style buildings may be seen in Photos #34 through 40.

Twentieth Century Flat, circa 1900-1931 (coded ~~brown~~^{blue})

The majority of twentieth century flats are two stories high and two to six bays wide. All are constructed of brick and have flat roofs crowned with a variety of simple terra cotta-coped parapets or with "pseudo" gabled roofs applied to the front facade. Unlike some of the nineteenth century flats, access to both upper and lower apartments is always through streetfront entrances. Flats built circa 1900-1915 can usually be distinguished from those constructed in the late teens and twenties by changes in facade treatment. In the earlier flats, the cornice and frieze zones are variously handled as projecting members (frequently terra cotta) or as flat bands of contrasting color brick sometimes laid in patterns. The use of contrasting color brick for the basement level is also common. Usually this involves a light-brown brick for the lower level and red brick above; stone is also a popular basement-level material. Untrimmed rectangular window and door openings are the norm for these buildings although arched openings (occasionally trimmed with decorative molded brick) also appear. Projecting front porches are a typical feature and often employ white glazed brick piers. While some flats exhibit historic detailing common to the Revival styles, it is used more sparsely. Representative examples of the early twentieth century flat are illustrated in Photos #41 through 54.

During the late teens through the 1920's, a number of flats, usually two stories, appeared with new forms of ornament. Arts and Crafts detailing similar to that found on the District's few bungaloid houses (also included in this classification) begin to replace or are mixed with older elements. Distinguishing characteristics include a narrow, tiled, false-roof facade supported by heavy brackets, curved or triangular parapets with terra cotta coping; open front porches (sometimes gabled), bracketed, gabled overdoors with tiled roofs, and rectangular windows often in groups of two or three. Stone and light-colored terra cotta are used to accent corners of buildings and ends of lintels and parapets. Typical examples of these later flats may be seen in Photos #55 through 61.

Commercial/Warehouse, circa 1891-1931 (coded brown)

The largest concentrations of commercial buildings along Gravois and Jefferson were established as the neighborhood's primary business strips by 1900. Built in styles closely paralleling residential buildings in the District, most appear to

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have been originally intended for combination first-story commercial and upper-story residential use; many still function in this way. Elements such as mansard roofs, parapets, and cornice and window treatment serve to integrate these buildings with purely residential buildings in the District. A few buildings such as 2137 Gravois were up-dated with new facades. This 1903 structure was modernized with Art Deco motifs in 1931 (Photo #67). Interspersed throughout the District are several buildings with cast-iron storefronts that often include an angled corner entrance with a cast-iron column. Commercially and residentially mixed buildings are coded with a brown bar. Typical examples may be seen in Photos #16, 17 and 62 through 67.

A small number of buildings in this category built specifically for commercial or warehouse use include modest examples such as those illustrated in Photos #68, 69, and 70 which maintain the neighborhood's residential scale, materials, and design elements. The former Bell Telephone Exchange Building (1903) at 2201 Indiana (Photo #71) is more formally articulated with brick quoining, a rusticated basement level, recessed round-arched brick windows and terra cotta embellishments. Occupying a full city block, the former United Railways Building has anchored the corner of Jefferson and Geyer for several generations. Built over a period of years (1898-1916) to accommodate the various needs of a streetcar line (car barn, oil room, power house), the complex has been well maintained. Red brick with limestone foundation, this one-story structure also relates well to the residential fabric. The building's north-east section (Photo #72) features pairs of recessed, round-arched windows separated by pilasters. Corbeled brick cornices with terra cotta coping and a distinctive angled skylight treatment are displayed in this portion of the complex. The gradually stepped sections of the south elevation (Photo #73) were built to allow for an interior streetcar ramp. Single segmentally arched windows are separated by pilasters; corbeled brick embellishes the cornice and the base.

Miscellaneous (coded orange)

This category includes pivotal institutional buildings illustrating a variety of styles generally not found elsewhere in the District and a few private garages and former stables which are distinguished by the quality of their brickwork.

Charless School, 1895 (Photo #74)

Named after an early land owner, Charless School (2226 Shenandoah) was begun in 1893 and completed two years later. Designed by St. Louis Board of Education Architect August H. Kirchner, it appears to have been little altered except for the primary facade gable. Three stories tall, the Romanesque Revival red-brick school has a projecting gabled center-bay section accented with colonettes at the upper corners and a front entrance featuring triple arches supported by colonettes. A corbeled brick cornice, lintel, and sill courses of red sandstone, along with the use of brown brick further enhance the building. The building was in use until 1978.

McKinley High School, 1902 (Photo #75)

Designed by nationally recognized school architect, William B. Ittner, McKinley High School (2156 Russell) dominates the neighborhood with its Jacobethan style

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design for which the architect is noted.¹ The central section is four stories high and features two crenellated towers. Wings on either side are three stories tall, topped with balustraded parapets. The stone basement gives way to reddish brown brick laid in garden wall bond; stone detailing is used in the window and door surrounds, tower, parapet and bay window quoins. Tudor arches at the entrance are repeated on the interior. The only major alterations are the non-contributing annexes to the east side (see Section 8).

Franz Sigel School, 1905 (Photo #76)

Also designed by William B. Ittner, the Franz Sigel School at 2050 Allen is three stories tall. A first story of red brick is laid in Flemish bond with dark headers. The second story is built of brown brick. Rectangular windows are closely spaced and separated by pilasters fashioned in rounded pressed brick for a basket-weave effect. Diamond-shaped brickwork, corbeled blind arcades at the cornice and open brickwork around the three round windows in the gables are details that lend texture to the facade. On the front elevation, gabled wings and a gabled entrance project from the central structure. The roof is tiled. (A non-contributing annex is located to the south.)

St. Marcus German Evangelical Church, 1914 (Photos #77 and 78)

Constructed of black-flecked brown brick, this Gothic Revival church (2102 Russell) has a crenellated bell tower embellished with buff terra cotta medallions, gothic niches, and lancet openings. Brick piers give emphasis to corners of the tower. Tudor arched, stained-glass windows with beaded terra cotta hood moldings appear throughout the transept and nave. Recessed terra cotta Tudor arches frame the triple entrance doors. The building was designed by architect Herman J. Burgdorf. Attached to the rear of the church is a two-story parsonage/caretaker's house constructed of the same materials as the church with the exception of the half-timbering effect on the second floor. Windows have heavy stone lintels and surrounds on the first floor.

St. Michael the Archangel Russian Orthodox Church, 1928 (Photo #79)

With its exotic profile and prominent location at 1901 Ann--visible from Highway 55--St. Michael's is a familiar sight to many St. Louisans. Built with funds donated by many denominations to help a local Russian Orthodox congregation secure a permanent home, the church is built of brown brick incised with an X pattern and features domes of traditional Russian-Byzantine architecture. The central, white stuccoed hemispherical dome is surrounded by four smaller onion domes rising from small drums. All five are surmounted with Russian Orthodox crosses. Round arched opaque stained-glass windows illuminate the three apses. A tile-roofed tower over the narthex has arched and shuttered openings, a simple Catherine-wheel window, decorative brick corbeling, and a brick arch over the entrance. It is capped with an onion dome and cross. The modified cross-dome, hall-church plan is typical of this style of architecture. The interior of the church is richly decorated.

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Serbian Eastern Orthodox Church, 1928 (Photo #80)

This ethnic church, located at 1910 McNair, follows building traditions of western Serbia in its brick construction with alternating bands of brick and stone and in the placement of the tower and dome.² The three-bay nave is marked by buttresses capped with stone and Palladian windows with colored opaque glazing. The primary facade features a central round-arched entrance framed with stone, surmounted by three slender round-arched windows and a roundel. Rising above the narthex is a square tower trimmed with an alternating brick and stone frieze and a stone cornice. The tower is surmounted by an octagonal drum displaying decorative brickwork and stone banding. An octagonal copper onion dome with Byzantine running ornament crowns the church.

Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

The McKinley Fox District is eligible for listing in the National Register under Criteria A and C, and is significant in the following areas: **ARCHITECTURE:** Largely multi-family residential, the District contains good representative concentrations of the major styles and types of St. Louis working-class housing built between circa 1865 and 1931. The buildings are distinguished by the quality of their materials, workmanship and vernacular design, and are unified by similar size, scale, materials and set-backs. They exhibit stylistic features of Urban Vernacular Classicism, Mansard/Italianate, Late Nineteenth Century Revival, Arts & Crafts and Art Deco. Pivotal institutional buildings include Romanesque Revival Charless School (1895) and two turn-of-the-century schools designed by St. Louis school architect, William B. Ittner, which exhibit characteristic plans and elevations for which the architect was nationally recognized. Two Eastern European ethnic churches built in 1928 embody distinctive Byzantine forms and a 1914 German church features a Gothic Revival design. Among noteworthy commercial buildings are the former Bell Telephone Exchange Building (1902) articulated in a Classical Revival style and the functionally expressive United Railways Company complex (1898-1916) both of which maintain residential scale, materials and design elements. **EDUCATION:** Built in 1902 when progressive trends in education were quite controversial, McKinley High School was one of the first two in St. Louis to offer students manual arts training in an effort to deter the city's high drop-out rate. The success of the vocational training program led to its adoption in other city schools. **ETHNIC HERITAGE:** During the second half of the nineteenth century and into the early twentieth century, the District was densely settled by Germans whose skills contributed to St. Louis' emerging industrial strength and also provided neighborhood services. The new immigration of Slavic peoples which increased after the turn of the century added to the city's skilled labor force. Serbs and Russians sponsored construction in 1928 of two Eastern Orthodox churches which served as a base for the conservation of cultural traditions unique in the city today.

District boundaries were determined on the north by Interstate Highway 44; on the east by South Eighteenth Street, a residential street paralleling Interstate Highway 55; on the south by Gravois, a multi-lane commercial artery (Photos #55, 69); and on the west by South Jefferson, an eight-lane, busy commercial thoroughfare (Photo #34). See Architectural Survey Map for all boundaries. The boundaries also generally follow those of early District subdivisions.

Originally part of the Petit Prairie of the St. Louis Commons, the McKinley Fox District saw its first development after the Devolsey and Kingsbury Additions were opened in the southwest portion of the District. The Devolsey Addition was laid out in June 1848 by Joseph Charless. It included a triangular tract of land bounded by Jefferson, Gravois and Shenandoah. Joining the Devolsey Addition to the north along Shenandoah Street, the Kingsbury Addition (opened in April 1856) was bounded by Jefferson on the west, a line one-half block east of McNair on the east and on the north by a diagonal line about 225 feet south of Ann Avenue (see Architectural

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Survey Map). The Addition and its streets were named after Kingsbury family members, although today only Jules Street retains its original name. (Shenandoah, Indiana and Missouri were originally platted as Kingsbury, Adele and Virginia, respectively.)

The opening of the Additions occurred during a period when St. Louis was experiencing a major influx of German-born who were moving into new sub-divisions on the north and south sides of the city. In 1850, almost half of the city's nearly 24,000 Germans had settled in southside wards where land was plentiful and inexpensive. Although the most dense settlement was first concentrated near the riverfront, the immigrants gradually followed the city-wide pattern of movement westward away from the river. An early indicator of settlement in the southwestern suburbs was the completion in 1859 of Charless School's first building on Shenandoah Street in the McKinley Fox District. Census schedules, deed research, and city directories confirm a predominantly German working-class neighborhood in which many early residents worked as carpenters, bricklayers, plasterers, laborers, mechanics, and teamsters. Two small brick houses at 2234-36 Gaine Street, for example, were constructed circa 1865 by carpenter Bernhard Hellmich and fresco painter Adolph Faehler, following an auction of sixty lots in the Devolsey Addition. Those houses, along with similar ones, such as 2238-40 Jules Street, built circa 1868 by carpenter Frederick Scheffelin (Photo #11), and others on Charless and Gaine (Photos #6, 7) illustrate features of an early vernacular classical tradition typical of St. Louis' nineteenth century working-class neighborhoods.

By 1875, portions of both the Devolsey and Kingsbury Additions were densely settled and a horse-drawn trolley running along Gravois Road connected the area to downtown St. Louis (Photo #1). During the last two decades of the nineteenth century, undeveloped lots in these additions were filled with larger two-story brick houses accommodating two to four families which often expanded earlier building conventions through introduction of features such as mansard roofs, Italianate cornices and Revival Style detailing (Photos #13, 18, 25, 35). By 1895, a larger school was required to serve the growing District and a new Romanesque Revival building was constructed on Shenandoah for Charless School (Photo #74).

By 1900, the McKinley Fox area, noted in school board records for its high birth rate and low death rate, required an addition to the Charless Grade School as a new tide of immigrants from eastern Europe increased the number of District residents. Germans, however, continued to settle in the area, and 1900 census records indicate that most owned their own homes and could speak and read English. Many worked in nearby breweries--a leading city industry. Bohemians who were moving into the District worked chiefly as skilled laborers such as watchmakers, carpenters, and brewery specialists. By 1900, Russians were a large minority group in St. Louis, second only to Germans in the total foreign-born population. Although as yet a small group, District Russians represented a high percentage of tailors and seamstresses and a low percentage of literacy in English. Compared with the Germans, fewer

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Bohemians and Russians owned their homes; approximately half were reported as renting flats.

In contrast to the working-class development in the Devolsey and Kingsbury Additions, the District's northern edge along Geyer Avenue is more closely associated with middle-class residential patterns of the Lafayette Square National Register and Local Districts which originally were continuous with McKinley Fox until the construction of Interstate 44 divided the neighborhood. By 1875, small private subdivisions such as Easton Place (later Waverly Place), Nicholson and Park Places connected Geyer and Lafayette Avenues and a number of houses lined the streets (Photo #2, right). Although the earliest houses once scattered along the north side of Geyer are no longer standing, both Geyer and Waverly Place survive with medium to large-sized 1880s and 1890s houses designed in Mansard and Revival styles (Photos #22, 23, 24).

The large tract of undeveloped land stretching south from Geyer Avenue to the northern boundary of the Kingsbury Addition was in use primarily as brickyards in 1875, even though it had been opened as Thomas Allen's Central Addition in 1869 (Photo #2, left). Towards the end of the nineteenth century, the still-unimproved land served as a neighborhood recreational area unofficially known as South Side Park where the Brotherhood Baseball League played and a racehorse track was operating near the future site of McKinley High School on Russell Avenue. Noted St. Louis realtor and horse track developer, C. Andrew (Cap) Tilles, along with two partners, acquired an interest in the South Side racetrack and experimented with the first night racing in the country in 1892 under arc lights on a three-eighths of a mile track. Although night racing was abandoned, day racing successfully continued until the facility was destroyed by a tornado in 1896.

Also victim to tornado damage were the smoke stack and power house of the Union Depot Railroad Company whose car sheds and yards were located in City Block 1349 bounded by Jefferson, Missouri, Geyer and Allen Streets. Serving the city's south side, the Union Depot Company was one of three principal trolley lines in the 1890s and an important stimulus to residential development in the area. The power house was rebuilt in 1898 and other buildings were added to the plant between 1902 and 1916 after Union Depot was consolidated as the United Railways Company. Articulated with extended rhythms of piers and bays trimmed with corbeled brick, the one-story red brick complex provides a harmonious counterpoint to the residential fabric (Photos #72, 73).

Shortly after the turn of the century, the South Side Park and racetrack land began to be rapidly built up with two and four-family brick flats. The District's peak construction years, 1902-1910, no doubt gained impetus from the selection of a site at Russell and Missouri for McKinley High School, the first public high school to locate on the south side. In fact, prior to 1904, there was only one white public high school in St. Louis. Completed in 1904, McKinley High introduced manual training

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workshops as an innovative experiment of School Board President Calvin Woodward designed to reverse the exceptionally high drop-out rate in the public school system. In his 1900 Annual Report, Woodward stated "...every year a vast army of public school boys and girls...in the middle of the district course, for one reason or another, stop going to school. These facts have the nature of a public calamity."² Woodward became a nationally-recognized figure in his efforts to turn public school enrollment around. Most of his efforts were directed at manual arts programs that supplemented more traditional educational courses of study which no longer seemed practical to those faced with making their way in a large industrial city. As Woodward explained, "Most and best of all, a Manual Training High School should be built immediately, capable of receiving 1500 boys and girls who have completed the lower grades. The value of such a school to St. Louis would be beyond estimation."³ Ultimately, as a direct result of Woodward's work, McKinley High School was built at a cost of about a half-million dollars, incorporating large shops with machinery in the plan in addition to conventional classrooms and laboratories. The school's enrollment rate for both night and day courses was so successful that a new school three miles farther south was erected fourteen years later.⁴ McKinley High School was designed by architect William B. Ittner, FAIA (1864-1936). Commissioner of School Buildings from 1896 to 1910 and then architect for the St. Louis Board of Education, Ittner's reforms in school design brought him national prominence and commissions for schools in twenty-nine states by the end of his career. The Jacobethan style of the Russell Street School is representative of Ittner's best known work (Photo #75).

The District's second school designed by Ittner was named after a German soldier in the American Civil War. Completed in 1905, the Franz Sigel School on Allen and McNair was also located in the former South Side Park area where residential building was proceeding at a rapid pace after the turn of the century. The building is a fine illustration of Ittner's interest in the artistic potential of brick with its Flemish bond red brick basement level and brown brick upper stories handsomely detailed with ornamental brick motifs (Photo #76).

Building permits indicate that over one hundred builders or architects constructed the large number of twentieth century flats which form the bulk of the District from Geyer to the south side of Ann Street (see Survey Map). While many were listed as architects on permits, city directories often report the same persons as builders or contractors. The quality of design, construction, and ornamental detailing varies little, however, whether the work of architect or contractor. Representing nearly every major type and style of working-class flat built in St. Louis during the first three decades of the twentieth century, District buildings form unusually cohesive streetscapes through their uniform set-backs, similar materials, scale and proportions (Photos #28, 29, 42, 43, 53, 56, 57).

The new housing offered improvements over typical multi-family buildings in older inner-city neighborhoods. Characteristic of the McKinley Fox flats were such things as modern plumbing, front yards, street-front entrances, porches, and frequently more fashion-conscious architectural detailing. The absence of industry

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in the District left it largely free of smoke-polluted conditions also commonly found in older residential areas. These features, along with new schools, good public transportation and neighborhood commercial services stimulated population diffusion from nineteenth-century districts located southeast of McKinley Fox.

For the most part, the twentieth century flats were built by owner/occupants of German descent, many of whom erected one or two additional flats as rental property. Evidence of the continued southwestwardly movement of Germans into McKinley Fox was marked by the construction in 1914 of St. Marcus German Evangelical Church on the southwest corner of McNair and Russell. Previously, the congregation had been attending services in their parish church built in 1866 at Third and Lafayette streets near the riverfront, although a parish cemetery on Gravois Road had been in use since the 1850s. Exploiting the corner site, the new brick Gothic Revival church featured a particularly fine corner tower richly detailed in terra cotta (Photo #77).

Many of the new flats were rented to members of the several Slavic ethnic groups whose numbers were increasing in the area after 1900. Serbians began to arrive in St. Louis around 1909, settling first in older neighborhoods southeast of McKinley Fox where they established Holy Trinity Serbian Eastern Orthodox Church at 1205 Park Avenue (razed). A new immigration of Russians appeared in the years preceding the 1917 Russian Revolution, and the World War I era brought another influx of Serbians. Like the Russians, many Serbs were tailors and contributed skilled labor to St. Louis' thriving garment industry. By the 1920s, Russians and Serbs along with other Slavic groups were well represented in McKinley Fox. Testimony to their presence was the construction in 1928 of two Eastern Orthodox churches modeled after traditional church designs of the fatherlands.

Before completion of the new church on Gravois and Ann, Russians worshipped in a house southeast of the District. In 1909, they had petitioned the Metropolitan Platon (head of the Russian Orthodox Church in the United States) for a priest to hold services for them on a regular basis. The community grew and by 1927 the parish had ninety-five families, many with thirteen or fourteen members. Funds for their new church (estimated to cost \$45,000) were raised through presentations of Russian music given by the church choir which brought in some \$20,000. The remainder was donated by prominent citizens and congregations of other churches. Dedicated June 2, 1929, the church followed the liturgical requirements of Eastern Orthodox church design and its exotic domes with Greek Orthodox crosses imparted a highly visible ethnic character to the neighborhood (Photo #79).

Sited to advantage on a large lot at the southeast corner of McNair and Geyer, Holy Trinity Serbian Church similarly displays traditional eastern European Christian forms with its onion-domed tower and brick and stone detailing (see Section 7, Photo #80). Over the years, the parish has preserved a measure of its ethnic heritage through perpetuation of the native tongue in church services and language instruction on Sundays after mass. In recent years, the parish has served as a base for the resurgence of traditional Serbian tamburitza orchestra music.

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McKinley Fox has remained essentially as it began: a working class residential neighborhood, for the most part stable and well-maintained. Ethnic groups have shifted from German, Bohemian, Russian and Serbian to Anglo-American; but they have been gradual, nearly imperceptible changes. Many of the people living in the District today grew up there and as second, third and fourth generation Americans now, they still retain old traditions in a small part of their lives. Proud of their homes, they are intent on their upkeep.

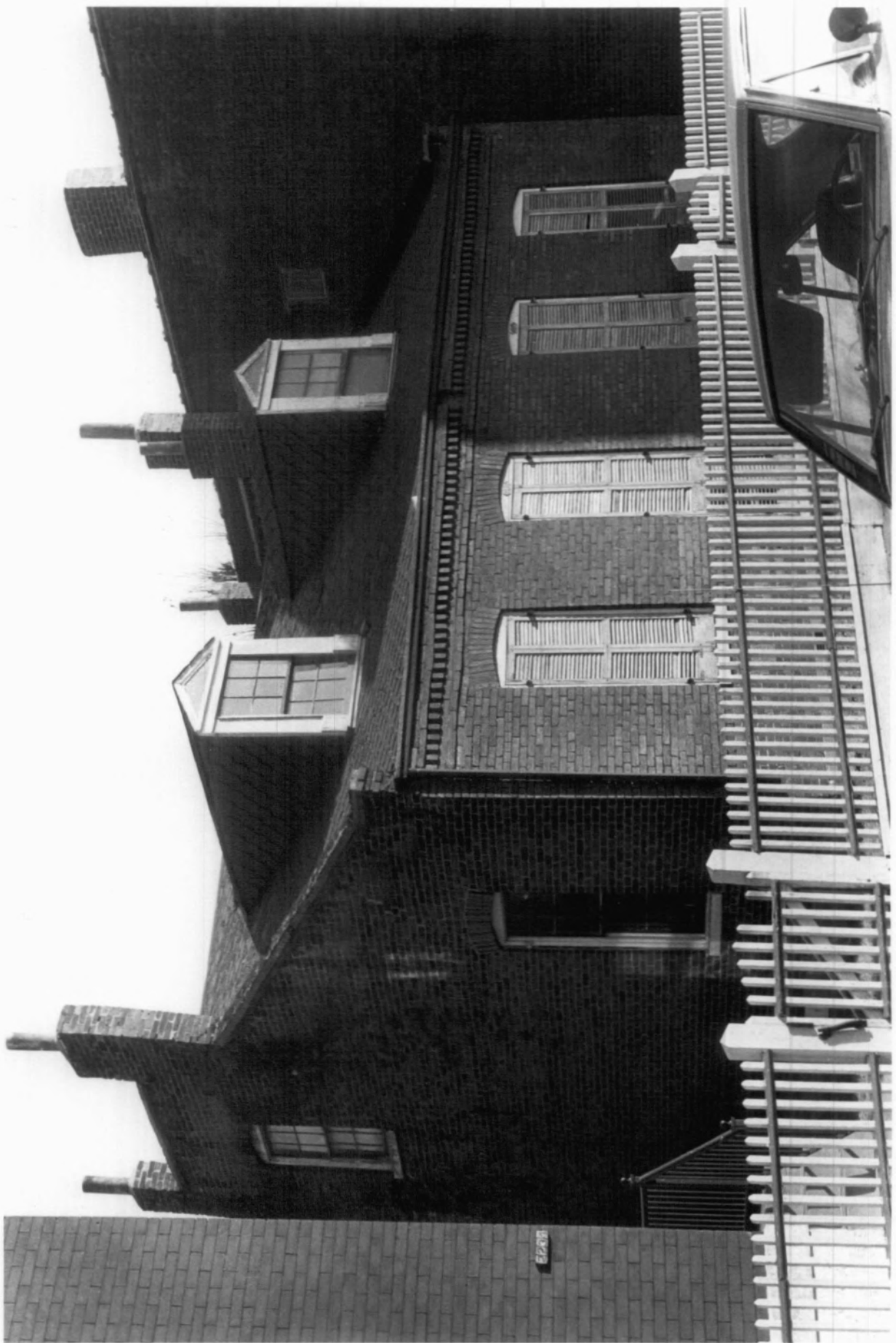
