Leading up to the front door is a three-step staircase followed by a long walkway and a make-shift temporary added two-step stool centered in front of the porch.

From the street level there is a five-step staircase with a single metal pole railing along its North side.

The front door is off center and is directly to the South of the bay window area that extends out from the main portion of the building. Centered on this Northeast corner extension is a large window that has two side-by-side panes. Leading up to the stoop porch and front door are two sets of staircases. The first has a single metal pole railing along its South side and the second set of four steps has two metal decorative railings along either side. There is a white fence railing along the edge of a concrete wall that drops down to the lower basement level
