This building is connected to the Bacon Ave. building by a long frame and glass breezeway with a flat roof and a turret in the middle.

There is a large, one story, white frame storage shed on Bismark with a hipped gable roof.

The caretaker's cottage is on the west side of the complex near the Bismark side. It is a large, white, frame, L shaped, one story building with a cross gable hip roof. It has 5 bays on the long side and is 8 bays across the front (facing east into the complex). It has a small screened porch, l bay square, with a shed roof at the north end of the front. The entrance is through the porch.

Convalescent Home on the same property. In 1919 the building on Bismark Ave. was opened.

In 1926 a dormitory, swimming pool and tennis courts were added. In the early 1950's the dormitory was partially destroyed by fire and the part that was salvaged is now the caretaker's cottage. The pool is gone. In 1928 the storage building was built as a recreation room and drama center for the campers. At that time the convalescent home was serving 40 patients and the camp enrolled 120 children in each two-week period.

In 1938 the camp program was discontinued as campers were sent by the Miriam foundation to Camp Hawthorne at the Lake of the Ozarks. The convalescent program continued until 1949 when the first modern rehabilitation program west of the Mississippi was instituted.

In 1956, the Rosa Bry-Miriam Rehabilitation Center was moved to the Jewish Hospital and Miriam No. 17 decided to start an education program for mentally retarded children at their Webster Groves property. Many Miriam parents were instrumental in organizing the Special School District.

In 1962 the Miriam School became a private day school for children with learning disabilities or emotional problems.

Emmanuel Cartwright, also a freed black man, became the minister of the African Baptist Church and took over the operation of the school in the middle of the Mississippi. After the Civil War, Cartwright helped to organize the Rose Hill Baptist Church in Kirkwood and was a frequent preacher at the First Baptist Church of Webster Groves close to his house on the part of Kirkham Avenue that was called Shady Avenue. The 1870 census indicates that John Berry Meachum's son was part of Emmanuel Cartwright's household. Cartwright also organized the state association of Baptist churches in Missouri for blacks.

This house should be nominated to the National Register because Emmanuel Cartwright was an important leader in black history in Webster Groves and St. Louis. Few would suspect the historic significance of this modest vernacular house.





school for blacks in the United States. Clayton served as principal from 1875 until the school board was able to find a black principal in 1879, when Clayton went back to the printing business.

In 1881, Auguste Mincke bought the land with apurtenances from Clayton for \$2667. In 1887, Auguste Mincke, a widow, sold the land with improvements to William and Hattie Oxley for \$3700. William Oxley was a bookkeeper.



between the first and second bay.

The south side of the house was originally the front, facing toward Kirkham Ave. and Webster Groves. Its western end has one bay under the main gable. On the first floor this bay is a one-story bay window with a hip roof. The next three bays are under the long side of the gable that projects to the east. The first or western-most of these three bays is the front door. These three bays have had a screened porch built in front of them on the first floor and a sleeping porch with a shed roofbuilt across the second floor.

Recessed one bay a two story addition with a shed roof projects to the east. It is two bays long and two bays wide across the back. Its roof slopes to the east from just under the east facing gable.

The north side of the house has one bay under the main north-facing gable. Recessed one bay there are two bays across the side of the east-facing gable. Filling in one bay of the angle created by the recess is a one-story addition with a shed roof sloping back to the east with a door and a window on its east side. The two-story addition with the shed roof that projects to the east (back) contains only one bay on this side. In front of this north side of the shed roof addition a long one-story addition with a shed roof sloping north has been built. It contains four bays on this north side and thus projects beyond the back (east) side of the two-story addition. Its eastern end has three small bays under an east facing gable and there are two bays on its south facing side. There is a carport along the north side of this north addition.

bay windows at the end of each gabled projection. The bay windows have flat balustraded roofs making second story balconies. There are awnings over these balconies.

The east building is  $l^{1}_{2}$  stories with cross gable projections making a U shaped courtyard on the north side, the front entrances. On the south side, across the back there are two stories of glass sunporches. The second story sunporches are in a large shed dormer in the low eaves of the main roof. There are second story oriel windows on the west side of each building.

The red tile roof, the gray stucco and the dark green trim of the casement and six-over-six sash windows give these buildings the appearance of belonging in Southern France.



At the turn of the century Leonhardt Nagel and his family lived here. People remember the Nagels as being unusual. Mr. Nagel had cows and sold milk but he chased children with a gun if he thought they were stealing fruit from his orchard. After a small earthquake Mr. Nagel noticed oil on the wings of the ducks in his pond and for sometime he considered drilling for oil.

In the late 1920's a family named Downey lived here. They had several beautiful daughters who were in the Ziegfeld Follies.

This house was burned severely in June, 1985 and is now vacant.
