There was a terrible fire in this building in 1939.

Phase 1 Survey Description This is a two-story concrete block building with a flat, parapet roof. The first floor of the fron is articulated stone and the whole building is painted off-white. The first floor has two store fronts with large leaded windows in five panels on the south and four panels on the north. There is an entrance recessed at the south end of each store and one panel of the large windows goes around the corner into each recess. Over each storefront there is a cast iron panel containing leaded fan lights over each window panel and door. In the center of the first floor is an entrance to the second story apartments. There is a leaded glass awning over the entrance.

2003 Update The building is now painted yellow. There is a simple stepped cornice approximately two feet below the roofline. The 1/1 windows on the side elevation and the second floor appear to be modern replacements. Each is sheltered by a cloth awning. The second floor apartments are now office suites.



2003 Update New windows have recently been installed on the first and second floors. The first floor storefront has been modernized - the bulkheads are gone as is the Art Deco style flat awning that was in place when the Phase 1 survey was done.

The Gore side has cast iron pilasters and an ornate iron comice. The two windows on the south half of the second story have large arched window frames with carved Eastlake ornamentation. 





2003 Update The frame shed section on the building shown that was in place in 1985 has been removed. A brick and iron fence, which surrounds a concrete patio, has been erected in its place. There are two brick archways on the west side of this patio. Large metal awnings cover portions of this patio.

Henry Schulz started a feed and grain business here in 1893, and later added a moving and storage company. The top floor of the building was a warehouse used to store furniture. Schulz lived at 60 Marshall Place nearby from 1909. His daughter, Harriet, married James McMillan, built 73 Marshall Place in 1935 and in 1959 opened the Rolling Ridge Nursery in her father's building. The north building burned in 1913 and was rebuilt.

A two and a half story, red brick, Georgian city hall with a slate gable roof. Across the front of the two and a half story part of the building is a monumental limestone portico supported by six stone columns, two stories high, each turned out of a single piece of stone. A square clock tower sits in the center of the gable peak with a clock face on each side and inside a twelve hundred pound bronze bell chimes the hour. A one and a half story wing with a flat roof projects two bays on each side (east and west) of the center section contributing to the symmetry of the building. 2003 Update In 2001, a second story was added over the east wing and two story addition were added behind the east and west wings. Like the rest of the front section of the building, these additions brick and have gable roofs with parapet end walls. Window lintels replicate the design on the original building.

The City of Webster Groves was incorporated in 1896 and city office were rented in a frame building on the corner of Lockwood and Gore that is gone now. In 1907 the City Hall moved into the Empire Building, 25 N. gore, and in 1911 it moved into the west end of the Gorelock Building on the corner of Gore and Lockwood. In 1922 the City of Webster Groves purchased the Congregational Church parsonage on the southeast corner of Lockwood conducted city business from that large frame house until 1932 when money raised in a bond issue of 1931 was used to fund the new City Hall designed by architects Hugo K, Graf, Charles L. Thurston and Wilber T. Trueblood. Wilber Trueblood had been the partner of Theodore Link, architect of Union Station, and he became the partner of Hugo Graf when Link

The Masonic Temple of Webster Groves was built in 1922 by Kremer and Veirol and was originally attached to the old frame Plant home. In 1961, the two-story frame house was torn down and the front added.

Free masonry came to Webster Groves in 1868 when a charter was granted to Grove Lodge No. 296. It disbanded six years later. In 1897, Webster Groves U.D. was founded with Worshipful Brother Joseph H. Tremblay as its first Master. The Lodge met on the first floor of Brannon Hall on North Gore and then in the new Bristol Building at Lockwood and Gore and then in the Empire Building on North Gore. The present location was purchased in 1914.

2003 Description According to county records, this building dates from the 1920s. Undoubtedly, it is the rear section of the building that gives the building this date. The rear section is a one-story building with a front-facing gable roof with corrugated tin roofing. The entire facade of the rear section is obscured by the newer front section of the building. The visible walls of the rear sections, the side and rear elevations, are covered with permastone or some type of stone veneer. The front section of the building appears to date from the 1960s or 1970s. It is an L-shaped, one-story building with a flat roof. 



This two-story brick building with a flat parapet roof has Classical Revival details. It has a broken pedimental portico of polished stone supported by Corinthian columns and pilasters over the front door in the center bay. There is a polished stone water table and stone window sills and keystones above the windows. There is a terra cotta string course above the second floor and a decorative terra cotta cornice. 
Phase 1 Survey Description

This limestone Gothic church has been added to and altered many times, growing irregularly. The front of the church faces Lockwood on the north and the oldest part of the building is recognizable as the west section. It is three bays, one and a half stories, under a gable facing north, the gable is articulated with a white terra cotta parapet. The three bays are divided by limestone buttresses and contain narrow Gothic stained glass windows. A square tower, two stories, with a bellcast hip steeple with small gable dormers on each side, is in the center of the front of the church and was added in 1893. It has two bays of Gothic arched louvers on each side of its second story. The first story is the main entrance, double oak doors under a stained glass transom, recessed into a Gothic arch which projects the depth of one stone making a shelter around the door with a limestone gable. A broad flight of stairs leads down to the street. East of the steeple is a section of the church added in 1893 with gables facing north and east and south. The north (front) facing gable contains one large, leaded, blue, stained glass window under a Gothic arch. This only shows on the second story. In 1923, a one story narthex addition was built across the front of the eastern section of the church.

2003 Update Since the Phase 1 survey, the earlier east addition has been replaced by a very large modern addition, which is faced with stone, is larger than the original church & has a gable perpendicular to the original church gable. In a cross gable on the addition, facing Lockwood, there is a large round stained

Congregational Church of Webster Groves. On a winter Sunday morning in 1865, walking the long trek to the Rock Hill Presbyterian Church, six men decided that it was time to start a church closer to home, a congregational church. These six men, William Plant, Alfred Plant, Charles Connon, William Porter, James Martling and R. P. Studley, had been Northern sympathizers during the Civil War. The only other Congregational Church in the state of Missouri at that time was the First Congregational Church of St. Louis, partly because Congregationalism was associated with New England and abolitionism. The first public worship was held on February 1866, in the Chapel Grove Seminary, a private school building built by John Helfenstein, Robert Studley, and

Description continued:

It has three bays of leaded windows and a flat roof surmounted by broad battlements.

The east side of the building is two and a half stories under a gable articulated with a white terra cotta parapet. On this side this main floor is actually on the second story. The main floor contains three symmetrical bays, the center bay being a large stained glass window under a Gothic arch, and the bays on either side being small stained glass windows under Gothic arches. There is a door onto a fire escape between the north and center bays but the symmetry of the three stained glass windows seems more important that this fourth bay. Three small Gothic arched indentations are in the gable. Between the first and second floors is a massive stone water table. The first floor is four bays, two of which fit under the large, center stained glass window, continuing its outer lines. The one story narthex addition on the front adds one bay on the north.

The south, back side of the older parts of the church is the equivalent of six bays. The eastern bay contains a stained glass window under a Gothic arch on the second story. The next three bays are under a cross gable with a large blue stained glass window under a Gothic arch on the third story in the gable. There are stone buttresses on the outsides of these three bays defining the outside edges of the gable section. There is another bay to the west and then the gable of the oldest part of the original church. Off of this section of the back of the church, two large rectangular, two-story Sunday school buildings have been added, one in 1926 and one in 1956.

The church has a small lawn on each side and attractive landscaping. There is a large parking lot on the east side on the corner of Elm and Lockwood. There is another parking lot on the west side of the building with access from Gore Ave.

History continued:

William Plant on Lockwood at Jefferson Rd. A small stone church was built at the present location in 1870 by F. William Raeder, the architect of Raeder Place in Laclede's Landing. Dr. Truman Post, minister of the First Congregational Church of St. Louis, laid the cornerstone and delivered the opening address.

The building was added to in 1893, 1923 and 1956.

Outstanding ministers have been Charles Kloss from 1898 to 1904 and again from 1911 to 1917, Dwight Bradley from 1920-1929, George Gibson from 1930-1938, Ervine Inglis from 1939 to 1962 and Paul Davis from 1966 to the present (1981). continuation sheet



its life. It was the Liggett Drug Company before the '20s and then a Rexall Drug Company and then a Glasers and now (1982) Don Sundhausen has an independent drug company there. Until the late 1950s there was an ice cream soda fountain in the back. The westernmost store was for many years a hardware store. McCurdy Brothers Hardware was there first and then Al Miller and his partner ran Gorelock Hardware until the 1970s. The second floors of both buildings are offices and have housed dentists and others. The post office was moved to larger quarters further east on Lockwood and the building at 107 W. The business started in a room in the Princess Theatre in downtown St. Louis. In 1915, the company moved to the prestigious Wainwright Building. In 1920, the company purchased the Capitol Town Mutual Insurance Company, a small fire insurance company, and Reliable became the first company in the nation to offer "multiple line" insurance to policy holders on a weekly premium paying basis. The company continued to grow moving into larger offices several times before erecting this building. In 1995, Reliable Continuation Sheet had 37 district offices in MO, AR and TX.

Phase 1 Survey Description This small one story brick building was not documented in the Phase 1 survey. It is sandwiched in between the back of 20-24 N. Gore and 50 West Moody and provides a link between the two buildings. The facade of the building is set back from the sidewalk and is partially obscured by a fire escape staircase serving 20 N. Gore. The building has an odd sloping roofline on the facade and a flat roofline over the rest of the building. There is a set of double doors and a 1/1 window on the facade.

Phase 1 Survey Description This build

This building was not included in the Phase 1 Survey.

2003 Description It is a 2 1/2 story brick building with an irregular distribution of windows and doors. The building faces Pacific, and the main entrance is located off center on the east side of the facade. This opening has been partially filled in and modern metal and glass doors installed. On the west side of the facade, there is another rectangular opening like the main entrance. This opening has also been filled in and has a single emergency exit in it. Both of these entrances are raised approximately 4 feet above the sidewalk. There are also three double hung windows on the first floor of the facade. They are irregularly spaced - one near the center and two on the east end. All three have arched brick lintels. On the second floor of the facade there are two windows on the east end and there are also two smaller windows near the center on the third floor. Above the first floor there are joist pockets in the brick indicating the presence of porch roof or awning of some type. There are several one story concrete block additions on the west side of the building. All have flat roofs.
