The second floor is flanked by two chimneys. Four sash windows flank a smaller modern sash window, all with plain lug sills. The first floor has two, triple sash windows topped with flat stone arches over plain lug sills flank a federal doorway with sidelights and a fanlight capped with a semi-elliptical arch, under a small square open porch supported by six doric capital columns. The porch has dentils and is centered between a patio with closed stone rails. Square bays appear on first floor. West bay formerly a covered carriage way, now walled up with glass and wood to form a sunroom. Both bays have open metal rails on top creating balconies.

The stoop porch features glass door and windows, metal rail, cantilevered roof and articulated stairs flanking both sides.

The chimneys project through the eastern and rear roof line. The second floor projects over the first floor and consists of three sets of three arcaded double hung windows. The first floor porch is supported by four square brick pillars with decorative trim in the corners, and a capped brick porch railing. The porch entrance is on the northeast end. Double doors with a single light flat transom with fan lights that are flanked on the east by a full double hung window and on the west by a smaller double hung window. The east side consists of a central two story bays, six evenly spaced double hung windows on each floor and an off-set chimney.

Under the cornice at the attic level four decorative square metal grating vents are separated by three rectangular ones. Under each of the seven vents is a large rectangular one-over-one window with a stone keystone arch above and a stone pyramidal lintel with egg and dart detailing below. The lower half of each window is graced with decorative ironwork. There is pyramidal quoining along the east and west sides of the north facade. Under the windows is a second cornice line with a raised floral motif below it. Below the motif is an awning made of vertical wood paneling with scalloped edges over first story doors and windows. Affixed to the awning is a store sign with craftsman-style light fixtures on either side. There is one recessed commercial entrance under the store sign which has a paneled door with original stained glass lights and fluted pilasters on either side and a stationary transom above. The plate glass display windows (which do not appear to be original) located on both sides of this entrance have fluted classical columns between them. At the east end of the north facade there is also a residential entrance that has a verde green (copper) awning above it, which is also not original. The northwest corner of the front facade has a cut-away corner entrance that is supported by a fluted doric column made of wood. This entrance is enclosed with cast iron gates. The paneled door at this entrance is graced by a diamond pattern, stained glass transom, a single sidelight, and plate glass display windows on either side.

In 1875, Father Joseph Schmidt, of the St. Mary's Parish in Cape Girardeau, requested aid from the Order of Franciscan Sisters of St. Louis to care for the sick in Cape. Three sisters, Philomena Oldegering, Engelberta Gramen and Felicitas Hueltenschmidt, answered his plea. When they arrived, they found Cape had no hospital facility and little nursing help available. They began the first St. Francis Hospital, consisting of 12 beds, which was inadequate. The hospital was the only one for miles around; people came in droves to be cared for by the Sisters. Finances were limited. Sometimes they had to pay for money to purchase coal or wood in the winter for heat. The sisters persevered. The Cape residents were grateful for the nursing care, and helped out when they could by donating clothing and medical supplies.

By 1878, the Sisters had purchased a lot on William and Sprigg and despite their limited finances, built a second hospital in 1879. The hospital also doubled as a school for St. Mary's Church. The hospital was expanded twice, first in 1882 and again in 1901. Very few patients could not pay for medical services, instead payment was in the form of food, such as vegetables and chickens.

By 1910 the Sisters realized that the hospital needed expansion again with more modern facilities. They launched a fund raising effort to raise \$12,000. When their goal fell short, local banker, C. L. Harrison, collected the balance needed. The Sisters then purchased the property on Good Hope St. between Pacific and South Ellis. The cornerstone was laid on October 12, 1913 and within one year, the 75-bed red brick building was dedicated.

Thousands of Cape Girardeau citizens attended the ceremony and watched the parades. Archbishop, John J. Glennon, was one of the Catholic dignitaries who addressed the crowd. Father Levan, the President of St. Vincent's College in Cape, celebrated High Mass on the morning of the dedication.

By 1917, St. Francis Hospital had become a member of the Catholic Hospital Association. In 1920, St. Francis was accredited by the American College of Surgeons. St. Francis had the region's first x-ray machine in 1923 and in 1925 a seven-bed obstetrical unit opened.

The hospital continued adding medical departments and by 1933, an average of 900 patients were admitted per year. The greatest number, 2,000, was in 1938. By that year it was evident that more space was needed. The \$225,000 addition was constructed by the McCarthy Bros. Construction Co. and built of the same red brick as the original. The hospital bed capacity increased to 125 with the new addition, which was dedicated in March 1939. Some of the new areas contained in the new wing included a solarium, two major operating rooms, sterilizing and instrument rooms and a clinical laboratory. The roof even provided a sheltered area for a garden for the Sisters.

The hospital continued to meet the medical needs of the community. In the 1940s with the polio epidemic, the hospital had nine iron lung machines. Surgical cases rose to 1,100 per year by 1947. By the mid-1960s it was necessary to expand the hospital once again. However, rather than build another addition, a new building was constructed in the west part of Cape and opened in 1976. The Old St. Francis Hospital on Good Hope changed hands many times before being condemned. At one time the building was owned by Southeast Missouri State University, providing dormitories for the nursing students.
