

The house at 605 Bridge St., Sweet Springs, is a frame, 1½-story Craftsman bungalow. In this essentially unaltered ca. 1925 example, the roof is hipped and flared and there are four hipped dormers. The full-width front porch--recessed under the main roof--is supported by three square, moderately tapering wood posts. The southwest corner projects where there are window seats. A cantilevered bay window with piano windows is on the north side. The front entrance is equipped with sidelights. Most windows are double-hung 7/1s. The gable roof above a side door is supported by knee-brace brackets.

The following description of the interior was provided by Sherry Johnson:
"The living room covers entire front with open staircase, built-in window seats, love seat, book shelves with pillar columns. Dining room has bay, built-in buffet and cases. (The first floor also has) one fireplace, kitchen, family room, and bath. Second story has coved ceilings in master bedroom. The open staircase has crosses carved into the railing."



The Smith/Owens House, 717 Bridge St., is a $2\frac{1}{2}$ -story frame American Four Square with an impressive Colonial Revival porch. The primary elevation is essentially symmetrical although the north end of the wide front porch (which extends several feet beyond the main block and wraps around on the north) has been enclosed and windowed. Dormers are gabled. Of greatest interest is the front porch. The entranceway is pedimented, with a patterned panel. Supports are Ionic (round fluted columns with capitals with volutes) resting on square posts with panels. Porch ends are semicircular. Small modillions are along the porch eave. The porch railing consists of solid panels alternating with windowlike cross-hatching. Steel siding has been installed.

The Spurgeon House is a frame, 2-story, cross-gabled Craftsman-style house. Although cross-gabled, the cross gable is well to the rear and the primary elevation is that of a gable-end house. A wide front-porch wraps around and its ends are gabled; on the south, the porch extends beyond the porch roof. An upstairs porch is under a projecting front gable, creating a multi-story porch on the south end. This house's rich Craftsman detailing includes shaped knee bracing, exposed pointed rafters, tapering square wood posts resting on square piers of brick, and windows with multipaned sash over sash with one large glass pane, and decorative, false beam-ends and flat stickwork in the gables, and window heads also featuring false beam-ends. Early Craftsman houses were often transitional in terms of styling, and in this case roof cresting reflects a lingering Victorian influence. The south elevation includes an exterior brick chimney, with ornamental masonry.



The Wilson House, 723 Bridge St., is a frame, two-story Colonial Revival house with a hipped roof and a centered, slightly projecting front gable. In ca. 1905, the four front rooms--two up and two down as in an I-House--were added onto an older building (log) which remains part of the present structure. A full-width front porch is gabled above the entranceway, which is centered in the three-bay primary facade. Porch supports are round wood columns atop short wood piers with panels. Both gables contain imbricated shingles. Porch eaves are dentilated. The front entrance is transomed, with sidelights. There are pilaster corner boards. "The back room was a log cabin with a lean-to porch. The front room and two rooms above was the kitchen. After 1900, four rooms were built on the front," according to Mary Edith Robbins and Frank Nelson.

The Kelley House is a frame, two-story Queen Anne house with a hipped roof and lower cross gables. The full-width front porch has an upper deck from which the railing has been removed. A front gable containing a sunburst design and a spindlework frieze frames a second floor doorway to the deck. Main porch supports consist of two triplets and one pair of square wood posts atop piers of ornamental concrete blocks, and there is a stick railing. The south facade contains a two-story bay window with a gable roof emerging from the main hipped roof. Imbricated shingles divide upper and lower elements of the bay window and flow rainwater away from the lower windows. The angle on the south side of the front gable has been filled with a room addition. Other alterations expanded and enclosed a rear porch and generally de-Victorianized the house. A window has been removed from the front gable. Cresting, porch railings, and an exterior stairway depicted in a ca. 1887 artist's sketch are not present today.

The Bellamy House, 200 Highland (formerly Ann) Ave., is a frame, 2-story house with a hipped roof and lower cross-gables, a wraparound porch (one side and front) and Queen Ann styling. Gables contain circular windows and imbricated shingles. Vertical and horizontal stickwork, painted a contrasting color, helps avoid a smooth-walled appearance. There is a small railing deck at the second floor level, above the front entrance. Porch supports are square wood columns, and there is a wood railing. Detailing including scrollwork corner bracing apparently has been removed, although at least one piece of scrollwork corner bracing is intact.





The Marshall facade has corner pilasters, more distinctive corbeling, window heads with flat instead of segmental arches, and more massive lugsills. Both lower storefronts have been reworked. On Marshall, the lower storefront has brick infill with a central, single-leaf entrance flanked by small display windows. On Lexington, the lower storefront has concrete block infill with a double-leaf central entrance flanked by small square windows. Some upstairs windows are double-hung 4/1s. Other openings are covered with plywood.





C. M. Kelley's Drug Store was in the building at this location in April 188 when a killer tornado ravaged much of downtown Sweet Springs. Two customers were killed and Mr. Kelley was injured at this site. The building was rebui along with most of the others that sustained storm damage, and it remained a drug store into the 20th century, 1888 and 1900 Sanborn maps indicate. In August 1908, Mr. Kelley (who had retired) drowned himself in the Blackwater River which flowed past his back yard. In the 1920s, this was Jones' Drug Store. It remained a drug into the 1930s, when it became an office of the Kansas City Power & Light Company. Later, Harold Berry and Glen Smith operated a dry goods and clothing store in this building, until the early 1980s.





The cornice is moderately corbeled above a decorative band and a recessed horizontal panel. The three upstairs windows (double-hung 2/2s) have pediment-shaped, cast iron hoodmoulds and iron lugsills. The lower storefront consists of a recessed, double-leaf, transomed entrance flanked by square, cast iron posts and sills and display windows with transoms. Posts contain recessed panels with profiled female heads and floral patterns. Entrance doors and display windows are smaller on this building than on the nearly similar east building, and transom windows are larger. The storefront is largely unaltered. The first floor ceiling is decorative pressed metal. The second floor was rebuilt after being demolished by a tornado in 1882.

Massive battered square piers of random rubble begin at ground level (or probably below ground level). Shaped roof beams which seem to curve upward impart an oriental flavor. Rafters are typically conspicuous. Gables contain flat stickwork. Elaborate interfaces repeat the shaped roof beams atop the piers. The random rubble is continued between the piers, forming a low wall for the open front porch and, in effect, two sun porches. The frame portion of this unique house is painted pink, with white and green trim.



The Tisdale House is a frame, two-story, side-gabled Colonial Revival style house with one-story side wings with railing decks. The slightly recessed main entrance is centered in the three-bay primary elevation under a small portico supported by fluted columns. Similar prominent, fluted corner pilasters are present at both ends of the main block as well as in the corners of the side wings. The entrance has a fanlight and sidelights. The south sidewing, originally an open porch with a deck, has been enclosed, in effect converting it into a sunporch. The 1914 Sanborn map shows a different house at this location but the 1929 Sanborn map depicts the present house.



The Sweet Springs Presbyterian Church is a steepled-ell church building with an entrance in the base of the tower. The intersecting gabled wings appear to be approximately equal in size. Although vinyl siding is a recent alteration, an attempt was made to retain the effects of the building's Victorian styling. For example, the imbricated shingles in the gable ends and in the upper level of the tower are covered with vinyl sheathing with an imbricated design. Original lacy detailing is retained in the belfry. The building's foundation was laid by George and Robert Fowler. In ca. 1950, an annex for a fellowship hall and classroom was added on the west. Later, another small classroom was attached to the addition. The additions are not readily apparent from the street. Vinyl siding is the most recent alteration, but its effect is attenuated because it was sensitively applied.





The Sweet Springs R-7 High School is a functional two-story brick building with vaguely Gothic styling in its modestly castellated front corners and entrance treatment. Light-colored copings and other trim contrast with the red brick walls. The building's horizontality is emphasized by a projecting course of lengthwise vertical bricks beneath the parapet and by a projecting course of endwise vertical bricks which serves as a water table. Immanuel Lutheran Church, 110 Main St., is a brick, two-story, Gothic-style, steepled ell church building. The 'steeple' is a three-story tower with a Mission-shaped top, containing a clock and belfry. Mission-shaped parapets have stone copings. Stone trim is used throughout the building, and is particularly effective in emphasizing arches over large window groupings and the arcaded primary entrance on Main Street. In 1956, a two-story brick education building was constructed as an addition on the south end of the church. As additions go, this one is relatively inoffensive. Although the addition lacks Gothic styling, elements of its modest architecture nonetheless reflect the primary building. (For example, stone copings on the addition emphasize the arch above a central window opening and its primary entrance is flanked by buttresses with stone copings similar to those on the older building.)

The Grother, Charles, House, a two-story frame front-gabled example, is representative of the vernacular Craftsman residences which were constructed in various forms in Sweet Springs from about 1910-25. In addition to visible roof beams and rafters, this example features a shedroof front porch which continues across the driveway, on the left, creating a porte-cochere. Tapering square porch supports rest on square columns of ornamental concrete blocks. Roof beams are elaborated into knee braces. The primary elevation is symmetrical (except for the off-center porch which continues into a porte-cochere), with groups of three windows flanking the front entrance and, at the second floor level, a small square window.

The Grother House bears a strong resemblance to a mail-order house model known as the "Shadow Lawn." However, whether this house was actually constructed from materials purchased from Sears, Roebuck & Co., Montgomery Ward, Radford or another supplier of mail-order houses was not determined. Plans alone may have been purchased and it is possible that construction was by Arthur Hagan, a local contractor associated with several of the city's Craftsman-styled houses. The house depicted in the plan obtained by local historians has a lower-pitched roof than the Grother House, and its porch supports are paneled and do not taper.



The brickwork cornice of this double-wide building is moderately corbeled, and is identical to the cornices of two connecting buildings on the west. The second floor contains four segmentally arched window openings with wood sills and double-hung windows (plywood covered). The lower front has a vehicle entrance with an overhead door in the west half, and another large opening (plywood covered) which probably included an entrance and windowing, in the east half. The cast iron sill of this opening was manufactured by the Wells & Craven Foundry, a Sedalia iron works which followed the Sedalia Foundry Co. Behind the front brick portion is a large, brick block addition which was constructed in the 1920s as a garage and repair shop. Some door and window openings in the east elevation have been bricked over. The foundation along the east side consists of field stones.

The painted name, Elsner Dry Goods Co., is visible above the leaded glass panel. This building has a mezzanine. The first floor ceiling has been lowered.

This is a frame, 1½-story cross-gabled house with a wraparound porch and lovely Queen Anne detailing. Porch supports are turned posts with lacy brackets. A three-sided bay window in the front gable has a paneled apron. The front gable contains a double window and is filled with imbricated shingles. Forward corners of the side gables contain uncommon narrow, cutaway windows. Dormers in the side-gabled portion are pedimented with tiny pediments containing imbricated shingles while various raised decorations, painted a contrasting color, filling the casings. There is an old, one-story extension in the rear, so the plan is cruciform. This house appears today in essentially the same form as depicted on the Sanborn map for 1929. The present owner, Betty Grigsby, operates a beauty shop in a portion of the house (Betty's Beauty Shop).



The Renken House is a frame, $2\frac{1}{2}$ -story, side-gabled Craftsman house. A large, projecting dormer continues through the cornice of the primary elevation. The front porch is full-width with a gable above the steps. The west elevation contains a hanging bay window with a gable roof. Shaped knee bracing abounds, while other shaped bracing is found under rooflets above windows in the dormer and gable ends. The visible rafters have pointed tips. Porch supports consist of groups of square wood posts with decorative bracing resting on square brick piers. Wood shingle siding is found in the gable ends and in the dormer, while the remainder of this large house is sided with narrow weatherboard. In addition to individual units, windows in various sizes are found in groups of two, three, and four. There is a centered, one-story porch in the back. A garage addition is on the east. Cresting has been removed from the gable ridges.



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

This frame, one-story, gable end church building is believed to have been constructed in ca. 1872. The entrance is centered in the windowless primary elevation which faces east. Sides contain three evenly spaced double-hung windows which have been shortened. A small steeple has been removed from the roof and the entrance has modern doors. A transom window over the entrance has been covered with a panel with the painted words, "Saint Paul's United Methodist Church, Founded 1872." Walls are asbestos-sided. Much of the remodeling occurred in the 1960s. An old parsonage is nearby, which also see.



The north half is two stories and the south half is one story but the entire building was probably built at the same time (to function as an automobile dealership). Courses of slightly projecting brickwork in contrasting shades accent door and window openings and emphasize the building's horizontality. Fenestration is intact with apparently original windows and doors in the south portion and upstairs in the north part. The old vehicle entrance has been replaced with a modern overhead door and first floor windows in the north half are probably replacements in original openings. A metal sign in a brick panel advertises the building as LaRUE AUCTION CENTER, GLEN LaRUE AUCTIONEER. This building contains an elevator used to transport cars to the second floor of the north building where they were stored.

Brickwork features decorative corbeled panels in the front and side parapets; pilasters in the entrance ensemble are accented by alternately projecting courses of brick. The parapet of the side (north) elevation is stepped, and brick pilasters define window bays and an intact storefront at the rear of the building with a central recessed entrance and flanking display windows. In a ca. 1960s remodeling, sandstone pilasters flanking the corner entrance were replaced with brick but courses of rough sandstone blocks are intact above the corner entrance, and the sandstone bases were retained. Other rock-faced sandstone is present as cornice trim, for accept in pilasters, as a string course aligned with second floor lugsills, as a lower belt course or water table, and as lintels with descents. With the exception of a double window in the narrow east facade, windows are single double-hung units (1/1s). Windows in the public elevations along Miller and Marshall have flat arches of sandstone. Windows on the less-public rear and south elevations have segmental, moderately rounded brick arches. The treatment of parapet panels is similar to the treatment of panels in a former lumber office building at 326 S. Miller St.



Despite the 20th century look of its primary elevation, this is a 19th century building as indicated by the much older appearance of its north wall and by the presence of two iron posts which apparently flanked an original entrance. The building was probably constructed in ca. 1885, given a new facing in the 1920s, and further changed in modern times. This and several other buildings in this block are skewed to accommodate off-axis Miller Street. In this case, the building tapers rearward. When this building was expanded into the adjacent building on the south, an existing entrance was removed and aluminum-framed display windows with transome were installed across the entire lower storefront. The brick cornice contains moderately decorative brickwork. The parapet of the unaltered north elevation is stepped and moderately corbeled. Three second floor window openings in the primary elevation contain double-hung 1/1 sash. Two of three original concrete lugsills have been replaced or stabilized by wooden boards. Side windows are similar in type. A canvas awning extends across the front of this and the adjacent south building.







This is the northernmost of three two-story commercial brick buildings, constructed individually in 1911, which share a colonnaded front of a continuous design. This building is not quite as deep as the middle and southernmost buildings. Five of the complex's 14 square brick piers which support the overhanging second level of all three buildings are in front of this building. Upstairs, between pilasters which are extensions of the piers, are recessed window groups. Each group consists of a triple window (a one-light sash in the middle flanked by a pair of narrower, double-hung 1/1s) and a multipaned transom of lavender glass. Limestone is used for trim including a coping, a dentilated band, capitals and bases, and lugsills. The three-building group has a classical order and balance, and the horizontal impact is enhanced by beltcourses of limestone, the band of window openings, thr row of piers, etc. Separate transomed, single-leaf entrances to 313a and 315a are recessed in a central alcove, and the rest of the storefront is display-windowed with nonferrous dividers. The door to 313a appears to be original and contains a large, vertical glass panel. The door to 315a seems relatively modern. The ceiling under the overhang is tin. Both stores have lowered ceilings. The ceiling above the display platform, however, consists of wood paneling with egg-and-dart moldings.

The pattern is repeated in brickwork aprons beneath paired windows flanking a central tapering recessed entrance in the primary elevation. There are modest buttresses. Above the entrance opening is a round segmental arch with a keystone. The paired double-hung 1/1 windows have concrete lintels with descents and concrete lugsills. Side windows are similarly treated. A short flight of stairs leads to a small hallway with a decorative tin ceiling and a floor of inlaid tile. Here there are three transomed entrances. Double doors (in the central entrance only) contain vertical panels of beveled glass. Awnings are over the main entrance and its flanking windows. This building's exterior is relatively unaltered.



A front dormer has a balcony porch and cornice returns. Main porch supports are square wood columns with curvilinear, capital-like brackets atop piers of rock-faced concrete blocks. The porch and balcony have balustrades. The upstairs is shingle-sided and the main floor has wood siding.

The Jarvis House, 600 Patrick St., is a $1\frac{1}{2}$ -story frame house with primarily Queen Anne styling. The primary entrance (centered in the east elevation, transomed and with sidelights) is cutaway under a gable filled with imbricated shingles. The main roof is hipped with lower cross gables (dormers), plus a gabled element in the rear whose ridge is the same height as the point of the pyramid. Predominant features include a one-story tower with a hexagonal roof topped with a finial and a full-width front porch supported by four tapering wood posts resting on square piers of ornamental (stone-faced) concrete blocks. The Jarvis House was probably built between 1910 and 1920, if not a few years earlier. It is possible that the Craftsman-style porch was a very early alteration, but more likely it it the original porch.

The Wall House, 202 Washington, is a frame, two-story, cross-gabled Queen Anne style house, Free-Classic subtype.
