front porch. The porch wraps around the east and is supported by Doric columns which run two stories in height emphasizing the chamfered corner entry of the porch. However, the principle front door flanked by sidelights is set on the other side of the facade in the western bay. There is a tripartite oriel on the second story of the west facade. Also, there is a two-story tripartite projecting bay capped by a gable with wooden

shingle sheathing the gable end. 43. HISTORY AND SIGNIFICANCE

The core of this building was constructed in 1889 for Julia Morris, a dressmaker. Charles E. Gill, of Gill's Livery, acquired this property in 1901. Mr. Gill made a substantial addition to the house in 1903 and added the monumental porch in 1916. This distinctive Eclectic building with its monumental front porch would contribute strongly to the establishment of an historic District in the Harris Addition area of high quality 19th and early 20th Century residential buildings.

44. DESCRIPTION OF ENVIRONMENT AND OUTBUILDINGS This corner property slopes west and is supported by a concrete retaining wall on the south and east. There is a two-car frame garage on the basement level on the east.


