He followed in the bricklaying trade until 1876 when he started into the building/contractor business. He continued this business until 1903. He developed Nowland's Addition which includes as series of double shotgun houses constructed of brick and includes 221-223 W. Isabelle St.

The first verifiable residents of this double house were Robert L. Tomlinson, in the poultry business, 221 and Theodore H. Roeseler, saloon keeper, 223.

He held the position as justice of the peace for 16 consecutive years. In 1872 he was appointed chief of the St. Joseph fire department and in 1882 was elected city attorney.
