

Prairie State Park's Mission Statement

To preserve and interpret the largest remaining example of original tallgrass prairie in Missouri. The park further provides healthy outdoor recreation for all visitors. The park is dedicated to sustaining a large tallgrass prairie in its native form for future generations to learn from and enjoy.

Birds and Prairies in Peril

The prairie habitat offers birders opportunities to see birds that are not easily found elsewhere. The Henslow's sparrow, dickcissel, upland sandpiper, greater prairie chicken and the short-eared owl are a few of the birds that call Prairie State Park home at one time of the year or another. Of these five birds, only the greater prairie chicken is found here year-round. All of these birds have a declining population.

Why the decline? Habitat loss is a key component in every case. The Missouri landscape was once at least 33 percent prairie. Now less than 1 percent remains. So these birds are being forced to try and survive in smaller and smaller pieces of prairie. Some of these birds need large expanses of prairie to survive and it just isn't around any more.

Think of it in another way. Let's say you come home from vacation and the street you live on has had a catastrophe and your house is the only one standing. You are fortunate, but is there room for all your neighbors to live with you? It would be a bit crowded. Would there be enough food, space, water and shelter? There will certainly not be enough shelter, and enough food is going to be hard to find. Some are going to have to live elsewhere, but how do they get there? Some just won't survive. This is the predicament prairie plants and animals are in and it is hard to survive.

What can you do? Prairie State Park would not be what it is today without the help of organizations like The Nature Conservancy, www.nature.org/ and the Missouri Prairie Foundation www.moprairie.org. By supporting them, you will help prairies that are in peril, which in turn will benefit the wildlife.
