building has a Circa 1940 one story yellow brick addition on its facade. The hall has its long axis on east and west elevations. These elevations each have four elongated 2/2 double hung windows with wooden sills. Lintels may have been removed. Flat brick lintels are in place now. These oversized windows and floor plan give this building the appearance of a hall. The east elevation contains a simple corbelled brick cornice. This same style of brickwork is present under the north facing gable. The east elevation has a ground level addition.

The rear building, with side gables facing east and west, has a two story yellow brick addition attached to it's east elevation. What appears to be an original window can be seen on the north elevation. This is a 6/1 double hung window. Rear or south elevation openings are boarded or infilled by masonry. Brick arches appear over most of these openings.



wooden sills. All openings have brick arches above. A simple corbelled brick cornice is in place on this elevation. The facade of this building faces south (See photo for 24 E.Front St., right). Here a double leaved wooden loading door is central to the first floor. A single door is in place on the SE corner. Above the first floor double door can be seen double leaved wooden doors on the second and third floors. Windows are 6/6, double hung with wooden sills. All openings have brick arches above. Below the roofline a decorative brick frieze in diaper pattern can be seen. A metal conveyor is attached to the roof.

The interior contains a wooden staircase on the east wall to basement and upper floors. Wooden supports are composed of five heavy wooden boards joined together. Wooden joists are heavy.

One story Building, Circa 1880

This building has a dressed limestone foundation, where it is unaltered on the east elevation and partially on the facade, or north elevation. The facade appears to have had severly deteriorated brick work due to water damage. . New brick work is evident on the NW corner of the facade. An offset wooden door appears on this elevation with brick arch above. Above and to the west of the door a window opening has been infilled with masonry. To the west of this a large and a small opening exist. The larger opening has an elevator accessing below ground level. The second smaller opening is a boarded window. The roofline is flat except where interrupted by a metal shed and vent. The east elevation contains basement level windows. First story windows are 6/6, double hung with wooden sills and brick arches.

here the door is single. This elevation also contains four windows. These are 2/2, double hung. All openings have brick arches above.A simple corbelled brick cornice can be seen below the roofline which is sloped. A wood and metal awning spans this and the building adjacent to the west. A masonry wall with openings seperates the rear addition from the building fronting Front St. The building on Front St. has a facade foundation of two different levels. A central wooden door at street level drops to below ground level on the interior from an open elevator. Five of the six facade windows containing glass are 6/6 double hung with wooden sills and brick arches. The roofline here is flat, parapet unadorned. Metal bins rest atop the flat roof.

On the interior wooden supports consist of three long, narrow boards joined together. Wooden joists are heavy on the second floor of the front building. On the first floor or ground level supporting wooden columns and joists are heavy in the front section of the building only. The rear addition may have been used as an office. It has tongue and groove paneling on some interior walls.

in a brick and stone foundation. The foundation level windows were added after 1870 probably by Peter Kappler. Second floor windows are 2/2 double hung and shuttered. Below the roof gables can be seen 6/6 double hung windows. The west facade is the primary facade and faces Lafayette St. A central door was originally in place on the first floor of this elevation. Below the roofline four six light windows are in place. These windows slide toward each other to provide ventilation. This elevation had a dormer window (now removed). The west window of the north gable wall was at one time a door to a balcony. This was changed by 1890. A window below that door has also been closed up. The south elevation porch was added after 1908, as part of a major renovation that removed the west elevation center door. There is now an entry on the south wall. There is a room addition at the SE corner of the building. An open frame porch has recently been added to the east elevation.

When the grade was changed these openings were altered to windows by masonry infill. A door and decorative cast iron porch were installed where the center window of the first floor facade had been. The first floor is now divided into three bays with floor to ceiling wooden pocket doors seperating the central hall from east bay. A plaster wall with a single door seperates the center hall from west bay. Windows which have been converted from doors and original windows are 6/6 double hung with heavy wooden lintels and wooden sills. On the interior these windows have slanted boxes and beaded trim. The two large "picture windows" on the facade are a circa 1950 alteration. Wooden lintels have been removed. At the rear there was originally an open frame stairs and porch accessing three rooms on the second floor. This also connected the main building with a detached two story brick kitchen, The kitchen is now attached to the main building by a second two story brick addition which adjoins east and west elevations of the two buildings. Circa 1860 the open frame porch was enclosed. A recessed entry with brick arch above can be seen fronting Lafagette. Windows here are 2/2 double hung withbrick arches above and wooden sills. A seam in the brickwork seperates this addition from the two bays to the north. Interior stairs are a straight run with decorative newel post. Circa 1950 a new roof was installed over the original on the south elevation changing the roofline to salt box. Originally the pitch over the addition was less steep. The original shingle roof still underlies tin and asphalt additions.

Further significant interior features include an original built in clothes closet on the second floor west, a boxed attic stairway in the same room, beaded woodwork and random width red pine floors throughout the building.

corner of the facade with brick corbelling still in place above. A matching corbelled brick band can be seen above the first floor window on the NW corner of the facade. These windows have brick arches above. Second floor windows have wooden lintels. A corbelled brick frieze can be seen above the second story. Above this a stepped parapet with flat crown at top center is in place.

This building has a brick seam which is apparent on the west and east elevations.The interior of the building is divided north from south by brick arches on the ground level. There is a trap door to a sub basement.The rear building is slightly less in length compared to the front building. Both structures have soft red brick and appear to be similiar in date of construction.

The west elevation (fronting Oak St.) has a corbelled brick cornice across the entire elevation.Masonry infill has reduced the window length. All windows are 2/2, double hung. A central entry on Oak St. has been altered to contain a new glass door with side lights. Original entry is evident in brickwork.

The rear elevation has masonry infill to a second story central door and again at SE corner of this elevation. Wooden lintels are still in place.

The east elevation contains a new door at the NE corner. A two story open frame porch is a recent addition. Windows and door have been shortened by masonry infill. Wooden lintels are gone. On the second story porch is acessed by a door. There is no exterior stairway.

multipaned, seperated by wooden mullions with transoms above. On the second and third floor facade central cast iron balconies supported by iron brackets are in place. Second floor windows are 2/2 double hung with wooden sills and brick arches. Some windows on the third floor and attic level are 4/4 double hung with wooden sills and brick arches. On the east elevation first and second floor windows and a door have been infilled with masonry. The east elevation roofline is a gable. The west elevation is a half hip. The east elevation contains four heavy wooden beams with wooden shims exposed between first and second floor. At the rear an open frame and metal porch exists which accesses three entries on the second and third floors. The west elevation contains a rear "L".Beneath the roofline deeply overhanging eaves protect a wooden cornice and dentiling. There is now galvinized facia board on the overhang.This cornice treatment spans the facade and west elevation.

On the interior pine floors are made of wide boards. Woodwork is pedimented. Central facade entry accesses both storefront and a staircase leading to upper levels.

secondary entries on the facade and east elevation with side lights. First floon/windows are now 1/1 with wooden sills and segmental jack arches which appear to be original lintel construction. On the second floor facade windows are 1/1 with wooden sills and brick arches. This window treatment matches that of a two story attached brick addition to the west. A circa 1890 renovation/may have seen the addition of the cast iron storefront, brick arched 1/1 windows and two story addition on the west elevation. The east elevation second story windows were altered to flat lintels when the third floor addition was added. Third floor windows are 1/1 with brick sills and flat brick lintels. The interior contains large wooden support beams and joist.

that contain recessed wooden paneling with brick arches above. A central entry contains a double leaved wooden door with three lights of glass in the upper three-fourth's of the door and a flat wooden lintel above. Flanking this door two windows are in place. The west window contains three lights of glass seperated by a wide wooden mullion. There is a wooden panel below the window opening. On the east the window contains nine lights of glass divided by thin wooden mullions. These windows have brick arches above. The second story facade contains a central opening with a fixed single pane of glass. This opening has jambs containing recessed wooden panels similiar to those of doors below. The opening contains a flat wooden sill and lintel. Flanking windows are new 12/12 double hung with arched brick above and new brick sills. Six pilasters seperate the facade bays. A high parapet is unadorned. The west elevation contains original 6/6 double hung windows with wooden sills and brick arches except where altered. Five bays toward the facade contain new 12/12 windows at the second level. This elevation contains three side entries on the first floor and four on the second.

An attached two story masonry addition at the rear matches in window treatment. A brick cornice continues across the side elevation of this building from the main building. The beginning of the addition is marked by a brick pilaster and change in window height. The eastelevation adjoins a concrete block building except at the last six bays toward the rear.

The interior contains large wooden supports and wooden beams running east to west. Pine floors contain random width boards. There is an interior wooden staircase on the east wall of the rear addition. An interior masonry wall seperates this addition. Interior woodwork is pedimented. A map dated 1869 called "The Birdseye View of Washington, Mo." shows this building to contain two one story side bays at each end of the facade that are now missing.

in the Mo. Meerschaum office shows this to be a $2\frac{1}{2}$ story federal style building with tin pyramidal hipped roof. The original entry is now reduced by frame infill however the original opening is discernable. Windows are 2/2, double hung, sash is curved at the top. Arched brickwork appears above the doors and windows. Some victorian style carved wooden moldings are in place above windows on the first floor facade and here sash is flat topped. Third floor windows on east elevation are flat topped sash. These window treatments are circa 1890. An additional door was added circa 1920 which accessed Cedar St. This door has a soldier's course brick lintel.

A circa 1890 addition contains five bays fronting on Front St. On the interior this addition has decorative, slender cast iron posts, supporting wooden beams. This system runs the length of the addition. These supports match supports in the original section of the building. There is an entry accessing Front St. in this addition. Windows are 2/2, double hung with curved upper sash. Brick arches appear above openings. The words "Missouri Meerschaum Corn Cob Pipes" and "Missouri Meerschaum Mfg.Co. Estd. 1872" span the facade of these two buildings. This addition contains a three story maple staircase.

A second addition, circa 1895, exists at the rear of the first addition. First addition exterior window sills face into the second addition. Interior supports consist of wooden piers on stone pads supporting wooden joists.

A third addition, circa 1910, has nineteen bays fronting Front St. A double leaved central door with multi paned transom above provides access to Front St. Windows are 9/9 on the first floor facade, 6/6 on the second, and 3/3 on the third floor. All are double hung with stone sills and flat tops. Soldier's course brickwork forms lintels.

a fourth addition, circa 1920 has five bays fronting Front St. Door and window treatment are similiar to that of the third addition. A metal pipe originally entered this building from the west elevation, carrying steam from an exterior source throughout the building. This addition alone has a concrete foundation.

the Missouri Meerschaum Pipe factory. The name Mo. Meerschaum derives from the fact that the Tibbe pipes had the same porous quality as the white, claylike mineral called meerschaum used in expensive carved pipes of that name. Tibbe incorporated under that name in 1872. Under Henry Tibbe and his son, Anton, after his death in 1896, the corn cob pipe became an international business commodity. Henry Tibbe was born 1819, he entered this country 1867 coming to Washington, Mo. in 1870

The roofline has deeply overhanging eaves, with side gables facing east and west. Circa 1940 the building was reroofed with asbestos shingles. Battens were removed as well as wooden roof brackets from the building's long axis.

NW corner of the facade has been replaced by a new door and the opening has been reduced in scale by frame infill. The transom has also been infilled by frame. Brick surrounds delineate both door openings. The central portion of the building contains four regularily spaced multi paned casement windows. Arched transom windows containing four lights of glass are in place above. The window opening is also delineated by brick surrounds. Soldier's course brick work forms a band dividing foundation from building and marking a water table at the level of window sills. This use of brick work also spans the facade forming a stringcourse slightly below the roof line. Under the eaves brickwork indicates there was some material attached to bricks at this level which is now removed. Below the stringcourse the words "Tibbe Power Plant" can be seen in cut white stone.

While the west elevation is without openings the east elevation which faces the Tibbe pipe factory has door and window treatment similiar to that of the facade.

The interior has a mezzanine on the north (facade) elevation. The buildis roughly divided in the middle by a wall. The east section of the building has a concrete slab floor while the west section has a dyed concrete floor laid in a grid pattern. Interior woodwork is intact.

First floor facade windows have brick arches and brick sills. This window treatment is the same on the second floor window of the western bay. The two bays to the east of the brick seam, at the second level, have cast iron lintels which are arched and decorative above new doors which lead to a cast iron balcony. New doors are in place here with old single paned transoms above. All opening have wooden shutters. New windows on the first floor facade have false multi light mullions behind single paned glass to give the appearance of older storefront windows. Above the second story a simple corbelled cornice is in place.

On the west elevation all windows have segmental jack arches except a recent window addition at the attic level toward the south.


On the east elevation first floor windows have brick arches. On the second and attic levels windows have flat brick lintels. All windows are 1/1 except on first story where false mullions are similiar to those of the facade. A new brick courtyard is in place on this elevation.

An interior hall is entered from the west facade bay. This contains a staircase with oak handrail and decorative newel post. Interior woodwork is pedimented above doors and windows.

An 1860 engraving by E. Robyn contains a detail of this building. At that time the building contained only two bays on the facade. These appear to be the two bays to the west because of the presence of the cast iron lintels. The engraving does not show a window on the first floor of the east elevation. The second floor of that elevation is obscured by tree branches.

First floor windows are 2/2 double hung with wooden sills and segmental brick jack arches. A wooden cornice contains decorative brackets (replicated on the facade) and wooden chain molding. Three dormers at the facade roofline are pedimented. Wooden dormer brackets are original.

Two story and one story additions are attached at the rear. These form an ell that is stylistically similiar to the main building.

The interior contains a central hall with a straight run staircase with continuous banister to the attic. The staircase is composed of an octagonal newell post, turned balusters and flat banister of walnut. The original plan exists with four rooms on each floor, two rooms in the attic. Double sliding wooden doors seperate a first floor double parlor. Interior wood work is Greek Revival.

Older Section, Circa 1865;

On the south elevation there is evidence of a large opening (Photo left) now bricked in and containing a door opening within the space of the original opening. It is possible that this large opening allowed entry of wagonloads of goods. The east elevation (Photo right) contained five opeings just below the cornice. It is possible that these were used as loading chutes into railway cars. The tracks are parallel to the limestone foundation. These openings are now bricked in however brick arches and stone sills are still in place. Recently a garage door has been installed central to this elevation. The west elevation contains evidence of four windows with transoms above now bricked in. Brick arches crown these. Brick piers are in evidence. A new door opening exists. A simple double band of projecting brick forms a cornice. The north elevation is attached to the newer section of the building.

Newer Section, Circa 1905

This section of the building has a dressed limestone foundation. On the north elevation double leaved wooden doors with two levels of three paned transoms above are existing. Windows are 6/6 double hung with limestone sills. Transoms are now boarded. Brick arches are in place above. The corners of the north elevation contain a frieze formed by a corbelled brick motif. Brick pilasters engage at the corners and extend beyond the roofline where they are capped by limestone. The east elevation also contains a double leaved door flanked by 6/6 double hung windows. Here three light transoms are in place above. Vent windows appear above transoms. On this and west elevation the frieze contains corbelling which spans the entire elevation. On the east elevation a brick pier and frieze project from the new section of the building to incorporate the older section of the building.

vent can be seen above dormers in roof. The east elevation has a central door flanked by windows. The east wing has broad overhanging eaves, and the roof is gabled. West Wing; Windows are 1/1. Round brick arches appear over openings. Facade door has multi paned transom above. A decorative brick gable appears directly above the door opening at the roofline. This gable is flanked by curved brick minarets which are crowned by terra cotta finials. The base of the minarets are terra cotta blocks which contain a floral motif. A half sphere opening with brick arch can be seen in the brick gable. A terra cotta frieze contains the words "Water Works" above a pressed metal stringcourse. The west elevation contains an original door similiar to that of the facade. A large chimney is in place on this elevation, which served the boilers. This wing has a pyramidal hipped roof.

An early lithograph of this building shows a second story open porch here which was enclosed by a decorative cast iron rail. The porch was supported by wooden posts and spanned only the three center bays of the facade. A recent addition of a broken pediment now crowns this and the door opening on the first floor facade. An old five light transom and four paned side lights are still in place. All facade windows now have colonial style crowned lintels. Second floor facade windows have been altered to french doors. Three dormers on facade roofline and a cupola are further recent additions.

An original door opening on the west elevation, now boarded, has a small five light transom in what appears to be original glass. The door opening is now surrounded by concrete columns and a broken pediment. Double chimneys are visible on side elevations. The west elevation has two windows closed by masonry infill. Remaining windows have straight brick lintels and wooden sills. Wooden shutters are in place on most windows.

The east elevation has a recent one story frame addition. Above this second floor windows have been infilled with masonry.

There is a two story attached addition at the rear. Windows are 2/2, double hung with brick soldier's course sills on the second story. First floor windows are boarded. The foundation is textured concrete.

Windows are 6/6, double hung, flat topped with soldier's course brick sills on the facade, rear and north elevation. The south elevation is composed of a new red brick wall circa 1980. On the north elevation there is a new roll up garage door at ground level. The foundation contains limestone rubble pilasters which divide the bays at the ground level only.

story facade has large window openings surrounded by white stone molding. Within these openings windows are divided into fours by vertical mullions. Each window is divided again into fours by horizontal mullions. Above windows a high, flat, unadorned parapet is in place. On the Jefferson St. side(west elevation) the building is constructed on ground which slopes downward to the north. Here ground and first floor windows are multi paned commercial. On the second floor windows are double 1/1, double hung, flat topped with brick sills. This level contains a central double leaved door without stair. There are ground level garage doors at the NE corner of this elevation. There is a two story brick addition attached at the rear of the main building (north elevation). This is a garage fronting Jefferson with a large garage door and multi paned commercial windows.

On the second story interior of the main building a steel truss system with radiating steel struts is in place running east to west.

and arched brick lintels. There is a decorative iron balcony on the second floor facade with two doors accessing it. It is supported by decorative iron brackets. There is a corbelled brick cornice beneath the roofline at the facade and rear. Pedimented dormers are in place on the west elevation. Dormer windows are2/2 double hung with arched tops. Chimneys rise from parapet walls on north and south elevations. The north elevation has a cellar entry into the main building.

There is a one story brick attached addition at the rear with a side entry on the north elevation. The addition is near the main building in date and has similiar window treatment. There is an open frame porch on this elevation. There is a frame addition on the rear (east elevation) at the roofline.

by two old limestone steps at the NE corner of the facade. A secondary Jefferson St. entrance may have existed at the first floor center bay. Here a large opening is partially infilled with frame in the lower portion while upper portion contains a large 2/2 window. A limestone sill is in place beneath the opening. Original windows are 6/6 double hung with wooden sills and brick jack arches above. At the second story facade a cast iron balcony is supported by decorative iron brackets. A door accesses the balcony from the second level. The facade contains corbelled brick cornice and brick molding. Exterior walls are soft red brick.

There is an attached two story concrete block addition at the rear of the main building. This circa 1960 addition is covered by brick veneer.

mullion to the west. A basement toward the rear of the building contains a small window on the south elevation. A twelve inch wall thickness can be discerned here as well as horizontal log construction. On the west and east elevations (front and rear) attic windows are in place. These are small 2/2 double hung with wooden sills. An open frame overhanging porch on the north elevation is now enclosed. Fishscale shingling appears below the front and rear gables. This is possibly a circa 1885 architectural element. There is a single chimney on the north elevation toward the front of the building.

The interior originally contained two rooms and attic. The enclosed porch provides two additional rooms. There was an entrance from Jefferson St. which is now obscured by the concrete block addition. Two layers of frame siding obscure the log building. 124 Jefferson Washington, Mo.

a new wooden colonial style framework. Second floor windows are new 9/6 with brick jack arches above. Third floor rear window is a double casement with three lights each side. The north elevation has a first floor side entry toward the rear which is reached from a concrete stair. A new wooden door is in place. There is a brick frieze which is delineated by brick mold above and below which serves to seperate the first from the second floor on the facade and north elevation (fronting Second St.). This same treatment can be seen above the second floor where the brick again serves as a frieze. The gable is pedimented and contains an **eight** light occulus within a three course brick surround. Flanking this wooden triangular panels are in place accentuating the lines of the pediment and occulus. Two pedimented dormers are in place on the north elevation roofline with original 6/6 double hung windows. Exterior walls are soft red brick. New wooden shutters are inmoveable.

There is a one story attached brick addition at the rear. The north elevation of this addition has a ground level entry now infilled with masonry and with a brick arch above. A single window is in place on this elevation.

All windows are 2/2 double hung with wooden sills. Pinless shutter hinges flank windows. Six brick pilasters span the facade on the first two levels. At the attic level four brick pilasters continue the facade design. There is an entry at the second floor accessing a cast iron balcony. The balcony iron has an acorn motif and is supported by iron brackets. Recessed brick panels seperate first and second floors on the facade. A molded brick cornice spans the facade forming a frieze and seperating second from attic levels. Brick molding appears above attic windows forming a frieze. Pilaster capitals rise above the roofline. A sloping parapet wall crowned by brick molding rises to meet outermost attic level pilasters.

Galvinized gutters span side elevation rooflines. Side and rear windows are 2/2 double hung with brick arches above. The rear elevation has a second story open frame porch.

A frieze is delineated by brick mold and corbelled brick cornice. These seperate the second from attic story and continue across facade to span 217 Jefferson. Similiar brick mold divides the first from second floor facade but does not continue to the adjoining structure. At the attic level a stepped parapet ends in a central crown with flat top. A half sphere window at this level contains remnants of original wooden shutters and multi paned window. An 1895 photo from the Washington Journal shows this building to be adorned with a wooden or tin structure on the parapet representing a medicine bottle.

The rear elevation contains 6/6 double hung windows, in a two story brick attached addition. Here an open frame exterior staircase accesses an open frame porch at the second floor. At the rear of the main building a corbelled brick cornice seperates second and attic levels and a half sphere window can be seen matching that of the facade.

On the north elevation, in the two story brick addition, a side entry exists with a brick arch above. This entry contains an old wooden door with double lights of glass filling the upper three-fourths of the door. The glass is arched topped and is surrounded by wooden channelling. The bottom of the door contains two recessed wooden panels.

The door jamb is channelled wood with caps. Second floor windows are 2/2, double hung with wooden sills and brick arches above. A simple dentilled brick cornice is in place above second story windows. The unadorned parapet and roofline are flat.

The rear elvation shows evidence of a large first floor opening. A brick arch is in place here with masonry infill below. The entry door has been moved to the north of this elevation. Windows are 6/6 with wooden sills and brick arches above.

This building shows brickwork on the facade to be toothed in with that of 219 Jefferson. This building has a cornice of corbelled brick, frieze and parapet which match that seen on 213 Jefferson (adjacent to north), however a seam is apparent in the brickwork between this building and 213 Jefferson.

On the second floor facade and side elevations windows have been shortened by masonry infill, and standard size windows installed. Above window openings brick arches are in place. On north elevation steps lead to a side entry near the rear of the building. The facade and rear elevations contain an attic level half sphere window. Only the facade has a stepped parapet. The rear attic window is central under the roof peak. Corbelled brick cornice exists on the facade directly under the parapet caps. Corbelled brick cornice spans the north and south elevations. An opening for a garage door has been created at the ground level of the rear elevation.

302 Jefferson is an addition that existed when an 1895 photograph of both buildings was taken for the Washington Journal in December of that year. This one story masonry building has a stone foundation. A facade entry is off set at the NW corner. Two large single paned storefront windws seperated by wooden mullion have transoms above and recessed wooden panels below. These windows appear to be original. A brick parapet is cantilevered out at the top of the building. An aluminum awning spans both the facade of 300 and 302 Jefferson or the first floor. Originally a metal rooved porch supported by wooden posts spanned these facades

A two story open frame gallery has been enclosed at the second floor on the north elevation.

The north elevation. The facade entry is recessed. Unaltered windows are 2/2 with wooden lintels and sills. Windows contain pinless shutter hinges. A few wooden shutters are in place. A corbelled brick cornice can be seen on the south elevation. (Fronting Fourth St.) Also on this elevation toward the rear an entry can be seen. The original opening has been reduced by masonry infill.

and has a sloped roof. An open frame exterior staircase accesses a small frame porch on the second story, south elevation. At the NW corner of the facade a three sided projecting bay displays ogee arch and finials above second story windows. There is a deep overhanging cornice which spans the entire building. A pedimented gable crowns the three sided projecting bay on the facade . Within this gable, at its lower level, can be seen scalloped wooden shingles.

brick lintels. The facade and north elevations have a frieze and deeply overhung cornice. Windows are set in recessed brick panels except at the second story, outer bays of the facade. Arched surrounds of white glazed terra cotta with a crowning volute are in place above most windows. First floor facade windows are crowned by a shield with the letter "W" on it on the outer bays. Six engaged and fluted doric columns divide the facade bays. A pediment overhangs the facade entry. The facade frieze contains the inscription "1839 City Hall 1923". A white stone stringcourse divides the water table from upper levels. A cornerstone is in place on the NE corner of the facade which bears the date 1923 and architects names; Boyer and Baum.
