Organized Jun, 1861, by written authority of General Nathaniel Lyon to Ferdinand Schmitz and immediately entered upon duty at Pilot Knob, under command of Colonel Bland, 6th MO Volunteer Infantry USV. In July, 1861, the company was ordered on duty, guard bridges of the Iron Mountain Railroad till it was mustered out October, 1861, by order of Colonel Carlin, commanding post at Pilot Knob.
